



Graduate Certificate in Homeland Security and Emergency Management

The Graduate Certificate in Homeland Security and Emergency Management (HSEM) is a 15-credit-hour program. The certificate can be adapted for pre-career and in-service individuals. Graduate students in other disciplines can use the program to supplement their primary fields. Career employees of public and private sector agencies seeking courses in homeland security and emergency management, especially those changing from professional or technical roles to managerial roles, should find the certificate program beneficial. Students must have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university to apply.
