Pursuant to Indiana Code Section 6-1.1-20-3.6(l), the following information is being provided:

1. The cost per square foot of any buildings being constructed as part of the controlled project.

### **Brownsburg High School:**

- 428,090 sf impacted
- \$62,690,000 estimated construction cost (excluding contingencies, equipment, fees, etc.)
- \$146.44/sf

### **Lincoln Elementary School:**

- 84,125 sf impacted
- \$14,110,000 estimated construction cost
- \$167.73/sf
- 2. The effect that approval of the controlled project would have on the political subdivision's property tax rate.

The property tax rate effect of the controlled project would be \$0.4117 per \$100 of assessed valuation based on the current certified assessed value of \$2,008,557,824 in 2024. However, the project has been structured to increase the payments over time as other obligations are retired. As a result, a net property tax increase of \$0.1002 will occur in 2017, please see Exhibit A. There has been no Assessed Value growth assumption made in calculating the property tax impacts.

### 3. The maximum term of the bonds or lease.

The maximum term of the bonds will be 20 years and the maximum term of the lease will be 22 years.

# 4. The maximum principal amount of the bonds or the maximum lease rental for the lease.

The maximum annual lease rental will be \$8,620,000 based on a \$95 million bond issue.

# 5. The estimated interest rates that will be paid and the total interest costs associated with the bonds or lease.

The estimated interest rates assumed in preparing the impact of this project range from 2.50% to 5.00% with the estimated total interest cost expected to be approximately \$50,637,257.83.

### 6. The purpose of the bonds or lease.

The purpose of the bonds or lease is to finance the renovation and expansion of Brownsburg High School and to construct the district's seventh K-5 elementary school. The high school work is necessary to accommodate on-going enrollment growth and to address existing facility condition needs, primarily in the original portion of the building which was opened in 1972. The elementary construction is necessary to accommodate on-going enrollment growth.
