

**Subject:** Report on Expenditures Per Capita

The attached Report on Expenditures Per Capita (“Report”) is filed in accordance with IC 6-1.1-33.5-7. The Report, prepared by the Data Analysis Division of the Indiana Department of Local Government Finance (“Department”), presents a compilation of each local government’s expenditures per capita based on 2010 and 2011 information provided by the local government’s annual financial report. Data were compiled according to the type of local government—counties, townships, cities/towns, schools, libraries, special districts, and conservancy districts.

Indiana Code calls for a report that includes each local government’s total amount of expenditures per capita based on the most recent federal decennial census. The Indiana State Board of Accounts provided expenditure information for all non-school local governments, while the Indiana Department of Education provided expenditure information for schools. The Department has determined the highest, lowest, median, and average expenditures per capita for each local government.

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## Overview of the Report on Expenditures Per Capita

This Report on Expenditures Per Capita (“Report”) provides an annual compilation of the total expenditures per capita of each local government with the authority to raise a property tax levy. Expenditure information reported here reflects calendar year expenditures for each local government as reported by the local government. The expenditures are the actual disbursements made by the local government and may be different from both the tax revenue received and the total budget appropriations authorized.

Each non-school local government is required to file an Annual Financial Report with the Indiana State Board of Accounts (“SBOA”). Except for data on school expenditures, all expenditure data are drawn from the 2010 and 2011 Annual Financial Reports filed by each local government with the SBOA. The Indiana Department of Education (“DOE”) provided all school expenditure information.

For the 2011 Annual Financial Report, SBOA made changes in how it gathers expenditure data from a local government unit. These changes result in a different net expenditure calculation compared to previous years. **Thus, comparing a unit’s 2011 per capita expenditure to 2010’s may show significant changes that are more attributable to the change in reporting than to a change in spending.**

Annual Financial Reports for 2011 are required by law to be submitted not later than March 1, 2012. As of April 20, 2012, not all local governments have filed their 2011 Annual Financial Reports. The notation “Data Not Provided” in the 2011 expenditure per capita column indicates that the local government has not yet reported its data for 2011. The percentage of local governments that reported expenditure data for 2011 is as follows:

- Counties (95.7%)
- Townships (97.4%)
- Cities/Towns (95.2%)
- Schools (98.2%)
- Libraries (98.3%)
- Special Districts (Solid Waste) (89.7%)
- Special Districts (Other than Solid Waste) (61.9%)
- Conservancies (87.5%)

As a comparison, the most recent 2010 per capita expenditures are supplied in this Report. In the 2010 calculation, a local government’s per capita expenditure is the sum of all its expenditures for a given year net of transfers, interfund loans, agency fund disbursements and purchases of investments, as identifiable in the Annual Financial Report, divided by the local government’s population.

## **Reading the Report**

Expenditure data in the Report are organized by local government type. Besides counties, all local governments are further categorized according to the county in which they provide service. Some local governments may provide services in more than one county; these local governments are listed once under the county with the greater share of the local government's constituency. If available, the population of the service area, not just the major county, was used to calculate the per capita expenditure amount.

For most local governments, expenditure data are reported per capita. As census data are not available for some Special Districts and Conservancy Districts, the local government's total expenditure is reported instead. For 2011 expenditure levels, each unit is ranked from highest to lowest and the unit's rank is listed next to the per capita data.

Several descriptive statistics are presented for each local government type:

- The Average is the total expenditure per capita for each local government type divided by the number of local governments.
- The Median is the middle expenditure per capita for each government type after the numbers have been numerically ordered.
- The Lowest is the smallest local government expenditure per capita for each local government type.
- The Highest is the greatest local government expenditure per capita for each local government type.
- The Units Reporting is the total number of units with Annual Financial Report submissions to the State Board of Accounts.

For government types for which population data are not available, these statistics are displayed, but are based on total expenditures for each local government rather than expenditures per capita.

## **Report Methodology**

Only the local governments that received a budget approved by the Department are included in this Report. There may be other local governments that were not required to submit their annual budget for review by the Department. These local governments are not included in the Report.

Expenditure data for 2011, for all units except schools, were drawn from a database within the Gateway for Local Governments. This database included fund-level disbursements for each local government as well as detailed classification of expenditures by type. These expenditures have not been audited. Updates made after April 20, 2012, are not included in the Report.

The Department subtracts certain disbursements to estimate a net expenditure. To calculate net expenditures, certain disbursement types were removed as they are not expenditures.

In the transition to Gateway for the Annual Financial Report, the classification and reporting detail shifted. Therefore, the disbursements that were subtracted to calculate net expenditures are not constant from 2010 to 2011. The Department worked with the SBOA to achieve the most accurate calculation of net expenditures. Calculations made under previous reports used the best available data and methodology, but were significantly different than the updated calculation. For the 2011 calculations, distributions for the following distribution codes were subtracted:

D701	Payments To or On Behalf of Beneficiaries
D702	Payment of Taxes and Other Payroll Withholdings
D703	Distributions to Other Governmental Entities
D704	Transfers Out
D705	Loaned to Another Fund
D706	Interfund Loan Repayments
D900	Purchase of Investments

For 2010 data drawn from the SBOA Annual Reports, expenditure data for counties, cities and towns, and libraries were drawn from a database provided by the SBOA. This database included fund-level disbursements for each of these local governments. Expenditure data for townships, special districts, and conservancies were drawn directly from electronic copies of these local governments' 2010 Annual Financial Reports submitted to the SBOA. These reports included fund-level disbursements for each of these local governments as well as general classification of expenditures by type.

For 2010, to the extent they were identifiable, disbursements related to transfers, interfund loans, agency fund disbursements and purchases of investments were then subtracted from the total expenditures to yield net expenditures for the local government.

Expenditure data for schools were provided by the DOE in a spreadsheet listing each school corporation's total expenditures, net of interfund loans, transfers and purchases of investments, for calendar years 2010 and 2011. School enrollment data were drawn from the DOE website at <http://www.doe.in.gov/sites/default/files/accountability/corporationenrollmentbygrade.xls>.

All census data were drawn from the 2010 United States Census with the assistance of the Indiana Business Research Center.

## Counties

County government in Indiana is responsible for performing many duties including law enforcement (which includes sheriff and jail services), elections, civil and criminal courts, and health services. Officials in county government also administer the property tax system.

Services provided by counties generally do not differ across the state; therefore, disparities in spending levels may be caused by differing levels of current capital investment and differing levels of efficiency.

Indiana has 92 counties. Based on the 2010 Census, the counties range in population from 6,128 (Ohio County) to 903,393 (Marion County).

The average per capita expenditure for all reporting counties was \$1,973.50. There is substantial variation in the amount spent by different counties. The median (\$1,803.39) is substantially less than the average, which suggests that expenditures are not uniform among all counties and that factors other than county population may be influencing the results.

**Please note that counties saw a large shift in levels due to the change in Annual Financial Report standards.** Previously, counties accounted for distributions of tax revenue in a classification entitled “agency funds.” In previous calculations made by the Department, agency funds were removed from the net expenditure data. This was the best calculation at the time using the available data. In the updated Annual Financial Report, all fund type classifications were eliminated, including agency funds. This accounting change created a different per capita expenditure calculation and makes comparisons from 2010 to 2011 difficult.

## **Townships**

Township government in Indiana provides monetary and in-kind assistance to citizens in need (“township assistance”) as well as fire protection and the performance of other duties for areas without other forms of municipal government.

There are currently 1,006 townships in Indiana, with populations ranging from 30 to 162,855. This wide variation in population, along with other demographic factors, results in townships offering varying combinations and levels of services. For example, smaller rural townships often rely on volunteer fire departments, while more urban townships may provide a full-time fire department or contract with a municipal fire department. Township assistance will vary in regard to economic conditions and differing local standards for qualification.

The advent of fire protection districts and territories has allowed many townships, cities, and towns to join forces to provide this service. The complexity of funding these districts makes it difficult to compare township expenditures purely on a per capita basis. A township may have lower expenditures than average because its expenditures on fire protection are reported by the consolidated fire protection district. Conversely, a township that purchases a capital asset such as a fire truck may have higher expenditures than average, even though the fire truck is used to provide service throughout the fire protection district. Townships may also contribute to funding services such as Emergency Medical Services (EMS) and parks that are utilized by taxpayers both inside and outside township boundaries.

The average per capita expenditure for all reporting townships was \$47.60. As with county data, this must be interpreted with caution due to the presence of very large and small expenditures. There is substantial variation in the amount spent by different townships. As with county data, the disparity between median (\$31.73) and average (\$47.60) indicates that other factors beyond population, such as participation in fire protection districts and territories, influence expenditure levels.

Township expenditures are grouped by county. Because townships cannot cross county boundaries, each township is listed once.

## Cities and Towns

Cities and towns in Indiana provide police, fire protection, and developmental planning. There are currently 565 cities and towns in Indiana, excluding Indianapolis which is considered to be a special district due to its consolidated structure. Population counts for Indiana cities and towns range from 22 (River Forest Town) to 253,691 (Fort Wayne City).

Differences in expenditure levels between cities and towns have many causes in addition to varying levels of efficiency. First, numerous cities and towns receive large amounts of revenue from specialized sources such as gambling riverboats that may allow for greater expenditures. Second, as with townships, cities and towns often join fire protection districts or territories, further increasing the complexity of comparing expenditures to level of service.

In addition, some cities and towns provide enterprise services, such as electrical, water, sewer, and solid waste removal. Cities and towns that provide these services may have greater per capita expenditures than cities and towns that do not. To facilitate review, expenditures for cities and towns are broken out by total non-enterprise net expenditures and total net expenditures, which is the sum of non-enterprise and enterprise expenditures.

The average per capita total expenditure for all reporting cities and towns was \$1,735.97. The disparity between the median (\$1,432.57) and the average indicates that other factors beyond population affect expenditure levels. In particular, economies of scale may be present in larger cities and towns that reduce the net cost of providing a given level of service to taxpayers.

City and town expenditures are grouped by county. Each city or town is listed only once. Cities or towns that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the county with the greater share of the city or town's constituency.

## Schools

School corporations in Indiana provide primary and secondary education to students. There are 293 school corporations in Indiana that report to the Department, with populations ranging from 1,338 (New Harmony Town and Township School Corporation) to 296,715 (Indianapolis Public School Corporation). Not surprisingly, these school corporations also have the smallest and largest number of students (169 and 33,080, respectively). Many school corporations provide transportation to and from school facilities and finance school buildings in addition to the core responsibility of education.

In addition to variations in efficiency, differences in school corporation expenditures are likely related to differences in spending on capital projects (such as buildings), transportation, and school programs (such as special needs education). The variation in capital project spending is now more influenced by voter preference than in previous years because of the availability of referenda for large capital projects. The cost of transporting students varies based on the geographic area of the school corporation.

The average per capita (per resident of the school corporation, not per student) expenditure for all reporting public school corporations is \$1,821.86. There is substantially less variation in spending per capita among school corporations than most other local government types discussed in this Report as evidenced by the median (\$1,769.07) being similar to the average.

## **Libraries**

Pursuant to IC 36-12-1-8(b), “public libraries provide free library services for all individuals in order to meet the education, information, and recreational interests and needs of the public.” Accordingly, libraries in Indiana provide books, magazines, newspapers, and other reference material to library patrons on a short-term basis. In addition, almost all libraries provide public computers and Internet access.

There are currently 239 library systems in Indiana, serving populations ranging from 181 to 877,325. Library systems are usually created by cities or counties and have boards appointed by the government that created them.

The expenditure data suggest that variations in expenditures between libraries are more consistently tied to population than among other local government types.

Library system expenditures are grouped by county. Each library is listed only once. Libraries that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the county with the greater share of the library’s constituency.

## Special Districts

Governmental services that are not provided by counties, townships, cities and towns, schools, or libraries are often provided by local government types referred to as special districts. The main types of special districts in Indiana are:

- Solid Waste
- Airport Authority
- Fire Protection
- Transportation
- Water

Every county is either part of a multi-county solid waste district, or has its own solid waste district. Therefore, determining the per capita expenditure for these districts is straightforward, and expenditure levels are presented here on a per capita basis.

Determining the population served is not possible given existing data for the other types of special districts. The total gross expenditure for these districts is instead provided.

The average per capita expenditure for all reporting solid waste districts was \$13.83. As with other local government types, there is substantial variation in the amount spent by different districts.

For special districts, the caveats regarding differences among expenditure levels are even more significant. Because the expenditures are not normalized on a per capita basis, greater variation is to be expected. Comparisons of expenditure levels between different types of non-solid waste special districts are not meaningful. Even comparisons between similar types are difficult due to the unique legal and financial conditions under which each district operates.

Special district expenditures are grouped by county. Each special district is listed only once. Special districts that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the county with the greater share of the special district's constituency.

## **Conservancy Districts**

Conservancy districts in Indiana are established for many purposes: flood prevention and control, drainage improvement, irrigation management, and wildlife and forest development. These districts are unique because they are established through the local court and are not handled the same way as other local governments. Conservancy districts are not subject to maximum levy limitations, and the tax rate applied to a conservancy district is calculated separately from the tax district rate.

Conservancy districts have well-established boundaries; however, the United States Census Bureau does not track population within these boundaries. For this reason, the data provided here are total gross expenditures rather than expenditures per capita.

The average total gross expenditure of conservancy districts is \$739,411.08. As with special districts (other than solid waste districts), there is a large amount of variation in expenditure level for these local governments. Since the expenditures are not normalized on a per capita basis, greater variation is to be expected.

Conservancy district expenditures are grouped by county. Each conservancy district is listed only once. Conservancy districts that serve populations in more than one county are listed under the county with the greater share of the conservancy district's constituency.
