

J.E. Roush Lake Fish & Wildlife Area Total Solar Eclipse April 8, 2024

Thank you for considering experiencing the total solar eclipse at J.E. Roush Lake Fish & Wildlife Area. Keep this information in mind to ensure that everyone is safe and has a great experience during this rare solar eclipse event.

- Plan to travel to the property early and expect delays when leaving. Heavy traffic is expected after the eclipse. Bring snacks and water with you. Ensure you have enough fuel for safe travels home.
- It is important to keep roadways clear while enjoying the eclipse to ensure safe passage of emergency vehicles.
- Parking is limited to designated areas only. See the map below. Recommended parking is at the north boat ramp parking lot (starred on the map) or the J.E. Roush Lake dam recreation area. The north boat ramp parking lot supports 80 vehicles. There are no spaces for buses or RVs. We will close the parking lot once it is full. You are welcome to park in any of the designated areas and walk on levees or other areas. Foot travel is welcome.
- Overnight camping is prohibited, except at the designated sites at the Kil-So-Quah Campground. The
 sites are first come, first served. There are 61 sites total, including 41 with electricity.
- It is important to wear eclipse glasses while viewing the solar eclipse.
- Please remember to sign in at any of the self-service boxes (also located on the property map).
- Note that J.E. Roush Lake is a flood-control reservoir. The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers controls the
 water levels of the reservoir, so if we get a high quantity of rain, some of the facilities and access roads
 may be closed due to flooding. Call the office before your trip and watch for property advisories on our
 website.
