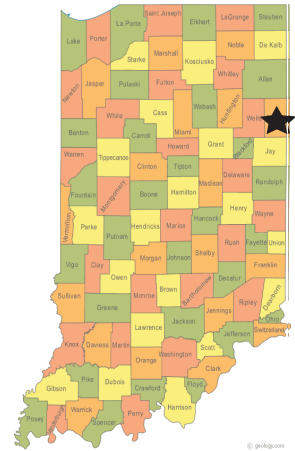


# Baltzell-Lenhart Woods Nature Preserve

County: Adams                      Size: 37 acres  
 Ownership: Nature Preserves - IDNR



## Location and Access

**Parking and Trail.** From Decatur, take U.S. 27 south for about 3.5 mi. to Co. Rd 200N. Turn left and travel about 0.5 mi. to the preserve which runs alongside the south side of the road for about 0.25 mi. There is a small parking area and a 3/4 mile trail.



**Description:** Victor Baltzell donated this land to the State in memory of his wife Alice Lenhart Baltzell. The woods is a mesic and wet-mesic flatwoods typical of the Central Till Plain, yet, unique in that it has an old-growth aspect due to the lack of trees removed during the Baltzell tenure on the property. The area is dominated by oaks and hickories, but the presence of such species as burr oak, swamp white oak, pin oak, red maple, sycamore, and cottonwood attest to its wetness at times.
