${ }^{3}$ Total Items: The range of items that will appear on the test to measure the skill.
${ }^{4}$ Approximate Percent: The approximate percent of total items which a student will complete for a given reporting category. The percentages are based on the total points for the test, not the points for the reporting category.
${ }^{5}$ Hard of Hearing Form: The Hard of Hearing $(\mathrm{HoH})$ form is available for students who are unable to participate in phonics instruction because they are deaf or hard of hearing. The HoH form does not include items that measure standards 1.RF. 3 or 2.RF.2.
${ }^{6}$ Operational Items: The items that contribute to a student's score.
