

Indiana Department of Revenue Vendor Codes for 1D Barcode

NACTP Vendor Code Required

To facilitate the Department's imaging technology, one dimension bar codes are printed on most forms. These are 11-digit barcodes, where digits 8-11 identify the software vendor. This vendor code is assigned by the National Association of Computerized Tax Processors (NACTP). Any vendor not having such a code can obtain one, free of charge, from the NACTP. 1D Bar Code Definition

Form Identification Barcode:

11 Characters (Numeric), 3 of 9 one dimension. A "non-proprietary" 3 of 9 bar code font which prints the same size as what is printed on the sample forms is acceptable. Sample forms show vendor code 1594, which is the IDOR vendor code. These four digits must be replaced with the software developer's code.

Code Definition: *FFYYVSPPPP* where:

*	Start Bar – this is a constant that must always be placed in front of the bar coded data.
FFF	Form type. (Identifies specific form: IT-40, IT-20, Schedule 1, WH-1, etc.)
YY	Form template year.
V	Form version. (Used if form modified mid-year or if Department and vendor versions must be different for some reason).
S	Sequence or Page number within the form which has data to be captured.
PPPP	Producer or Vendor – NACTP (National Association of Computerized Tax Processors) assigned, 4-digit vendor code to identify the producer of the form. Vendors without such a code may obtain one at no cost. Visit the NACTP Web site at http://www.nactp.org/index.php/about-nactp/nactpidrequest
*	Stop Bar – this is a constant that must always be placed at the end of the bar coded data.
