Item Description: **NATIONAL SUMMER TRANSPORTATION INSTITUTE (STI) (2007).
(Provide a host site, design and implement a five-day non-residential program for student participants.)**

Work Description: The Indiana Department of Transportation (INDOT) is seeking proposals to host a National Summer Transportation Institute (STI) Program in 2007. The selected firm must provide a host site, design and implement a five-day non-residential program for student participants that includes the components and tasks described below. INDOT will review these program components to develop performance goals and objectives for the selected firm.

PROGRAM COMPONENTS:

- 1) A strong core curriculum that introduces high school students to the variety of transportation careers and provides educational enhancement activities. These programs will offer a stimulating introduction to the transportation industry, with a particular emphasis on highway construction jobs and careers. Activities will include field trips, hands-on projects preparing students to enter apprenticeship programs, and presentations by professionals in the transportation industry.
- 2) Enhancement activities to expose students to various methods and activities designed to improve study habits and increase academic achievement. Such activities would include, but not be limited to: sessions on time management, study habits, SAT prep, library use, computer skills, and vocabulary development.
- 3) STIs may draw upon the expertise of INDOT to conduct outreach, recruitment, and technical assistance activities directly with the 16-18 year old high school population.

PROGRAM TASKS

The selected firm will, at a minimum, perform the tasks described below. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) Indianapolis Office and INDOT will comment, and approve all updates, revisions of reports and other publications prior to usage, printing, dissemination, and posting as instructed in each task.

Task 1: Develop an Implementation Plan.

Within 30 days of the selection announcement the selected firm will submit a 2007 Summer Transportation Institute implementation plan to INDOT. This plan will describe in detail, the tasks to be performed over the life of the award and the cost associated with each task. The selected firm's plan must include, but not be limited to, procedures for student selection, parental requirements, risk management, staffing requirements, inter-modal advisory committees, host sites' roles and responsibilities, specific named partnerships, as well as, STI curriculum.

Task 2: Create a General Curriculum.

The selected firm, with the assistance of INDOT and FHWA, will create a

general curriculum for the program. This curriculum will include and focus on educational endeavors that (1) expose students to all aspects of the transportation industry and its role in society; and (2) create awareness and stimulate interest in the students to take advantage of the opportunities that exist in the transportation industry, including highway construction and related technology careers.

Task 3: Conducting Follow-up Survey of Program Participants.

The selected firm will conduct a follow-up survey of STI student graduates during their senior year in high school or final year in alternative programs from which students are recruited. This survey will focus on the career and academic decisions made by the students. It will be intended to serve as an indicator of the number of students considering academic studies and transportation related careers.

Task 4: Prepare Required Reports

The selected firm will submit progress reports to INDOT and FHWA as required. The reports will summarize the results of each of the program's activities and include student and faculty evaluations.

Task 5: Requirements for Implementing Section 508 Standards of the Rehabilitation Act.

In addition to the work requirements specified in this announcement, the selected firm will ensure that all electronic documents that they prepare will meet the requirements of Section 508 of the Rehabilitation Act. The Act requires that all electronic products prepared for the Federal Government be accessible to persons with disabilities, including those with vision, hearing, cognitive, and mobility impairments. Selection Procedures

The Department will directly select consultants for each of the items listed above and further described herein, based on a Letter of Interest (LoI) and other required documents. The requirements for the LoI and the [Consultant Selection Rating Form](#) (Exhibit A below) that will be used by INDOT to evaluate and score the submittals are shown below.

To be eligible for selection consideration, prime consultants and sub-consultants must be prequalified, as of the “Response date and time, unless otherwise specified within the item description. Prequalification requirements and the list of Prequalified Consultants and their approved categories may be found at the [Department’s Website](#). A prime consultant need not be prequalified itself for each discipline listed in the prequalification requirements paragraph below provided that at least one subconsultant be prequalified in each discipline and provided further that the LoI and the contract procured hereunder shall only contemplate or permit an entity to perform work for which it has been prequalified.

Requirements for Letters of Interest

A. General Instructions for Preparing and Submitting a Letter of Interest

1. Provide the information requested in the LoI Content (Item B below), in the same order listed, signed by an officer of the firm. Scanned signed documents or electronically applied signatures are both acceptable. Do not send additional forms, resumes, brochures, or other material unless otherwise noted in the item description.
2. LoIs shall be limited to a total of twelve (12) 8½” x 11” pages. Ten (10) pages for [Identification and Qualifications](#) and two (2) pages for the combined [Key Staff and Project Approach](#), unless otherwise noted in the Project Description. The Affirmative Action Certification, Current and Completed Projects form, Active and Pending Contract Balances form and priority List do not count toward the total.
3. **LoIs must be received no later than the “Response Due Date and Time”, as shown in the RFP header on page 1. Submittals will have to include all required attachments to be considered for selection. Responses received after the response deadline shall not be considered.**

B. Letter of Interest Content

Identification and Qualifications

1. Provide the firm name, address of the responsible office from which the work will be performed and the name and email address of the contact person authorized to negotiate for the associated work.
2. List all proposed subconsultants, DBE/MBE/WBE status, and the percentage of work to be performed by the prime consultant and each subconsultant. (See Affirmative Action Certification requirements below.) A listing of certified DBEs eligible to be considered for selection as prime consultants or sub-consultants for this RFP can be found at the “Prequalified Consultants” link available from the [Department’s Website](#) .
3. Remaining space within the ten (10) pages, Section A.1 may be utilized to provide personnel resumes, additional information concerning qualifications, etc.

Key Staff and Project Approach

1. List the Project Manager and other key staff members, including key subconsultant staff and include the percent of time the project manager will be committed for the item, if selected. (The percent requirement is not applicable to open-end contracts.) Include project engineers for important disciplines and staff members that will be responsible for the work.

Address the experience of the key staff members on similar projects, and the staff qualifications relative to the required item qualifications.

2. Describe the capacity of Prime Consultant staff and their ability to perform the work in a timely manner relative to present workload and the availability of the assigned staff.
3. Provide a description of your Project Approach or of your approach to the advertised services. For project specific items confirm that the firm has visited the project site. For all items address your firm's technical approach, understanding of the project or services, cost containment practices, innovative ideas and any other relevant information concerning your firm's qualifications for the project.

Requirements for Affirmative Action Certification

A completed Affirmative Action Certification form is required for **all** items that identify a DBE or MBE/WBE goal, **greater than "0"**, in order to be considered for selection.
