# Celebrating 16 years of restored Huey history

PERU, Ind. – American Huey 369, in association with the National American Huey History Museum, will celebrate 16 years of restored Huey flight at the annual Gathering of Veterans and Patriots on August 13–14 at what will become the site of the new Huey museum in Bunker Hill, Ind.

The weekend is set aside to recognize and honor all veterans who have an interest in the American Huey helicopter and the missions it carried out during the Vietnam War.

"Everyone is invited, including those patriots who may not have served, but always supported our troops. Come spend the day with our veterans and the Huey that we depended on," said John Walker, member and Huey advocate. "It's not just about Vietnam, it's about the passionate, life-saving capability of this helicopter."

This year, the organization celebrates its 16th flying season since the first Huey was restored and flown by the organization, and its 18th year in efforts to preserve, educate and pay tribute to all veterans.

"The Vietnam War was considered a helicopter war because of the Huey. Nearly 7,013 Hueys were delivered to serve in Vietnam; there would've been 100 times more people killed during those years without it," Walker said. "The Army maintained the largest number of Hueys, at \$30 million per aircraft. They still fly today in the U.S. and all over the world."

American Huey 369's primary mission is preserving the iconic helicopter, known to many veterans, but especially to Vietnam veterans. During the Vietnam War, the helicopter allowed for the quick evacuation of the wounded from areas of battle.

"Most troops had a 98 percent chance of survival if picked up and transported back to a surgical area by Huey in a medivac (Dust—Off) effort," said Walker.

The Huey was also instrumental in transporting troops in and out of areas of responsibility, resupply, mail, and utility. Some were also gunships which participated in the fighting.

American Huey 369 has three restored Bell helicopters available for guests to see during the Gathering event. The Army UH-1H #70-16369, the Army UH-1H #63-08803 and the gunship, Army UH-1B 64-14049. The helicopters will perform a fully-narrated downed pilot rescue re-enactment (air/ground) on both days of the gathering. The performance is narrated by combat Vietnam veteran and Dust-Off pilot Phil Marshall (a Purple Heart recipient) with the Wolf Hounds Living History Group, Black Lions, and combat Vietnam veteran pilot Peter Bales and his OH-6 Loach also participating. The re-enactment begins at approximately 1 p.m. both days.

"On Saturday, guests will have an opportunity to see a fly-over during the playing of the National Anthem, see progress on the new 34,000-square foot Huey museum currently under construction, participate in a benefit auction and enjoy a catered lunch from Wild Bills BBQ," said Walker. "On Sunday, we will hold a morning service, and the lunch and re-enactment will also take place."

With more than 200 core member volunteers, American Huey 369 is member-owned and member-driven. Entry to the Gathering is a \$10 donation to the Museum. Funds will support the construction project and continued preservation of the Huey.

"Restoring and flying the Hueys is who we are, but history depends on this and so we devote our time and passion to it," Walker said. "The 369 wasn't even supposed to fly again and we brought it back because it's important for future generations to know its history and contributions."

"But the Huey is also a catalyst for Vietnam veterans to heal," he said. "When they hear that two-bladed, 'whomp, whomp!' again, it can bring a tear to their eye."
