The Mobile Vet Center is here to help families. service providers, military units, schools, and all other organizations that have contacts with military veterans.



In 1979, Congress mandated the establishment of Vet Centers to provide readjustment counseling services to Vietnam era Combat Veterans who were experiencing problems adjusting from military life to civilian life after having served during war times. Due to the success of the Vet Center in addressing the needs of combat Veterans, the program was expanded to include veterans who served in post-Vietnam conflicts as well as WW-II and Korean War veterans and those who have experienced sexual harassment/ trauma in the military. Today there around 300 Vet Centers, and 75 Mobile Vet Centers

located throughout the United

States and it's territories.
