Evansville Wartime Museum

Promoting awareness of the Evansville region's wartime contributions and home front legacy.

VANSVILLE





The Army-Navy "E" flag was awarded to companies who met and exceeded production schedules. Many companies in Evansville received several E awards during the war years. A radio from the period sits atop a cabinet displaying rationing books and other high-demand items. Rationing of consumer goods contributed greatly to conserving crucial supplies for the war effort.





Barbara Ericson was a Women Air-force Service Pilot (WASP) and a member of the Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS). She picked up and delivered various military aircraft to and from factories and air bases in the U.S. She is the only woman awarded the Air Medal during WW II.



Boot

Bootz Manufacturing Company, Inc. made sheet metal stampings and sheet metal assemblies. The company became Evansville's first war factory, fabricating steel products for the Army and Navy. Bootz earned six E awards during the war for its production of practice bombs and cooking equipment.



International Steel was a steel company that created the Landing Ship, Tank (LST) warships for WW II. They were built in the Evansville Shipyard between 1942 and 1944. The shipyard produced 205 vessels - the most of any shipyard in the U.S.

Karl Kae Knecht was an artist who served as a cartoonist, and later as a photographer, for the Evansville Courier from 1906 to 1960. His drawings helped to keep local morale high as local industry boomed.





Republic Aviation Corporation Indiana Division produced more than 6,000 P-47 Thunderbolts, nearly 39 percent of all P-47s built during World War II.



The Thunderbolt was effective as a short-to medium-range escort fighter in high-altitude air-to-air combat and ground attack in both the European and Pacific theaters. The P-47 was designed around the powerful Pratt & Whitney R-2800 Double Wasp 18-cylinder radial engine, which also powered two U.S. Navy/U.S. Marine Corps fighters, the Grumman F-6F Hellcat and the Vought F-4U Corsair. An advanced turbosupercharger system ensured the aircraft's eventual dominance at high altitudes, while also influencing its size and design.



Chrysler, in partnership with an Army Ordnance team, got to work at their Plymouth assemply plant making .45 caliber cartridges. By April 1944, the arsenal produced 3,264,281,914 rounds. Chrysler also produced almost a half-billion .30 caliber cartridges, hundreds of thousands of specialty rounds, reconditioned 1,662 Sherman tanks, rebuilt 4,000 Army trucks, delivered 800,000 tank grousers and was preparing to make fire bombs when the war ended.

P-47 D-RA-40

The Hoosier Spirit II is one of more than 6,000 P-47s built at the Republic Aviation plant in Evansville during WW II. The plane arrived at the museum in October 2021, after a long and storied history. The plane made its debut flight on Sept. 19, 1942. Formerly known as "Tarheel Hal", it has returned to Indiana where it is now Indiana's official state aircraft.

The M4A4 1943 Sherman Tank is one of 7,499 tanks produced by Chrysler's Detroit Tank Arsenal. It was the most widely used medium tank by the Allies and proved to be reliable, inexpensive and largely available. The tanks were part of the "striking echelon" of the armored division and performed many missions with superb mobility and firepower.

BE VIGILANT OF PACT ACT SCAMS

On August 10, President Biden <u>signed the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson</u> <u>Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act (PACT Act) into</u> <u>law. This law helps millions of Veterans and their survivors by:</u>

• Extending VA health care eligibility for Veterans with toxic exposures and Veterans of the Vietnam, Gulf War, and Post-9/11 (Post-September 11, 2001) eras



· Expanding benefits eligibility for Veterans exposed to toxic substances and their survivors



Tips to Avoid PACT Act Scams

Scammers are taking advantage of new opportunities to commit fraud. There's been an increase in PACT Act-related <u>phishing (email)</u>, vishing (phone), and <u>social media scams</u> targeting Veterans to access their PACT Act benefits or submit claims on their behalf.

Veterans should be cautious of anyone who guarantees a lucrative financial benefit or service.

Do's

You may submit your application securely <u>online</u> via VA.GOV or in person at any Regional Office. You may file your claim directly with VA and then, VA will assist in gathering evidence necessary to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply.

Be cautious of companies who advertise VA benefits can only be obtained with their help. These companies may not be recognized by VA and may be attempting to charge illegal fees.

Be cautious of aggressive companies who may try to pressure you to sign their contract through frequent communications or by insisting "you must act now or lose your chance for benefits."

Be cautious of companies who claim to be contacting you on behalf of VA or to have a special relationship with VA. Contact VA at 1-800-827-1000 if you are unsure about the authenticity of any message received.

Validate: If you are interested in working with a Veteran Service Organization (VSO), agent, or attorney, use the Office of General Counsel <u>Accreditation tool</u> to confirm and validate their credentials.

Don'ts

Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a percentage of your benefit payment in exchange for their assistance with your VA claim. If you need help filing a claim, there are representatives of VSOs, agents, and attorneys who have been <u>accredited by VA</u> to assist you.

Do not sign a blank form for someone else to complete later. Always review the completed form before signing and keep a copy for yourself.

Do not be fooled by companies who advertise they have special relationships with medical professionals and can guarantee your benefits award. If they are defrauding the Federal government, you could be held responsible for paying those benefits back.

Do not provide your social security number, medical records, or other personally identifiable information to anyone offering claims assistance before confirming their credentials using the Office of General Counsel <u>Accreditation tool</u>.

Do not sign forms that are not <u>VA generated</u> or third-party authorization for someone to provide "behind-the-scenes" claims assistance.

www.VA.gov/PACT is the official source of PACT Act information.

We want Veterans and survivors to apply now for their PACT Act-related benefits. To report suspected scams, please contact the VA Office of Inspector General <u>(OIG) Hotline (va.gov)</u>. File a complaint with the <u>Federal Trade Commission</u>. Visit the <u>Cybercrime Support Network</u> for additional <u>resources</u> to help Veterans, service members, and their families combat cybercrime.

ELIGIBILITY FOR BURIAL

Military Discharge: Veterans separated under conditions other than Dishonorable are eligible for burial

National Guard & Reservist: Must have been eligible for retirement pay at time of death.

Active Duty Death: Service members who die on active duty, in the line of duty.

Surviving Spouse: The surviving spouse of an eligible veteran can be buried at the IVMC.

The Child of a Veteran: Child must be under age 21 or permanent dependent of the veteran.
