

What is JAG?

JAG is a national non-profit organization dedicated to dropout prevention by helping at-risk students overcome barriers to high school graduation. Since 2006 the Indiana JAG program led over 9,000 Hoosier students to stay in school through graduation, then pursue post-secondary education or secure quality entry-level jobs leading to career opportunities.



This year more than 5,000 students participated in 118 JAG programs located throughout Indiana.


