Getting Hired

WorkOne centers provide one stop for workers and employers. These centers serve as a clearinghouse for up-to-date listings and the workers to fill them.

Job Matching and Referral

If you are looking for a new job, many employers post their openings at WorkOne. Statewide job listings are available through the center's computer network at www.in.gov/dwd.

Skills Assessment and Referral

You can connect with the state's network of job training programs established by federal law. Training is funded for individuals who meet certain eligibility criteria.

Resumes and Job Search Assistance



Through the state's Rapid Response Initiative, both employers and workers facing job loss can receive special services to ease workers' frustrations and speed transitions to new jobs. Services include training/retraining, outplacement assistance, job search workshops, financial aid beyond unemployment benefits, and coordination with other state and local service providers.
