Regional and State Unemployment (seasonally adjusted)

Regional and state unemployment rates were generally lower in November. Forty-three states and the District of Columbia recorded unemployment rate decreases, three states posted rate increases, and four states had no rate change, the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics reported. Forty-five states registered unemployment rate decreases from a year earlier, while five states and the District of Columbia experienced increases.

The West continued to record the highest regional unemployment rate in November, 9.9 percent, while the Northeast again reported the lowest rate, 7.9 percent. Three regions experienced statistically significant over-the-month unemployment rate changes: the West (-0.4 percentage point) and the Midwest and South (-0.3 point each). Over the year, all four regions registered significant rate decreases, the largest of which was in the West (-1.1 percentage points).






