FACT SHEET About Family and Caregiver Training



What is Family and Caregiver Training?

The Family and Caregiver Training provides education and support directly to the family caregiver of an individual using waiver services. The service is intended to increase the confidence and stamina of the caregiver to provide supports to the individual that are relevant, meaningful and propel them toward their vision of a good life. Education and training activities are based on the family/caregiver's unique needs and must be specifically identified in the Person-Centered Individualized Support Plan.

Family and Caregiver Training is available on both the Family Supports and Community Integration and Habilitation waivers. The annual reimbursement limit has been increased to \$5,000 per waiver budget year. The PCISP must clearly identify how the educational materials and training programs, workshops and conferences enhance the caregiver's knowledge, skills, confidence and/ or stamina.

Educational materials and training programs, workshops and conferences may relate to:

- Understanding the disability of the individual utilizing waiver services
- The caregiver achieving greater competence and confidence in providing the necessary supports
- Developing or enhancing key parenting strategies
- Supporting the individual in developing selfadvocacy skills
- Developing advocacy skills
- Developing and accessing community and other resources and supports

Individuals and caregivers should work with their waiver case manager to locate activities and resources that may be available to them with the support of Family and Caregiver Training.
