

## 1810 Camp Fire – Council at the Grove

“Council at the Grove” is an educational reenactment event to be hosted on the “Council Grounds” of the Vincennes State Historic Sites (next to Grouseland), where families and visitors can tour camp fire “stations” to enjoy storytelling and cultural demonstrations of life in the Indiana Territory in 1810. Demonstrations encompass early American pioneer, Native American and soldier/militia life.

Participants should check in at the registration tent before entering the encampment.

Demonstrations and storytelling will be held from 7:00—10:00 PM on Saturday, August 21.

### Directions to Grouseland:

**From US 41 (North or South);**  
**Take the Hart St. Exit**  
**(turn left from south / turn right from north);**  
**Go west on Hart St. to 2nd St.;**  
**Turn left on Harrison Street;**

**From Illinois; take IL 33 across Lincoln Memorial Bridge**  
**(Vigo St. / IN 441);**  
**From Vigo St., turn left on 2nd St. to Harrison;**  
**Turn left on Harrison;**

***Grouseland is located at 1st and Scott Streets***



Grouseland was built from 1803-04 and served as the residence of the Indiana Territorial Governor, William Henry Harrison, until 1812. It was the first brick home built in Indiana. Harrison later served as the 9th President of the United States (1841). The mansion was saved by the Francis Vigo Chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution, in 1909 and has been open for tours since 1911. Grouseland was named a National Historic Landmark in 1961.



## Walnut Grove - a new commemorative historical park

Walnut Grove commemorates the 200th anniversary of the meetings of territorial governor, William Henry Harrison, and Shawnee leader, Tecumseh, from August 1810–1811. Harrison was unmatched in opening up the western frontier to American settlement by treaty with the Native American tribes. Tecumseh opposed these treaties and became a symbol of Native resistance, pride and their struggle to retain their land and heritage.

This new park area was acquired by the Grouseland Foundation through the generosity of Vincennes University and provides much needed green space to the campus of historic sites at 1st and Scott Streets. The landscaping is designed and cared for by Dallas Foster of Vincennes. In addition to the mosaic of the Walnut “treaty tree” and the official State of Indiana historical marker, the park contains

native species of prairie grass, walnut trees, flowers and shrubbery.

Walnut Grove provides Grouseland Foundation with a new focal point to interpret the history of Grouseland, Harrison and the Indiana Territory from a Native American point-of-view. This allows Grouseland to engage in an honest dialogue and objective assessment of our history, without resorting to ideological biases or revisionist interpretation.

*May this park always serve as a reminder of the beauty of our land, and the diversity of cultures that populate it.*

*May it also remind us of the aspiration for peace and the importance of peaceful negotiation and the price paid in lives when war prevails over justice and understanding.*

7:00 PM – 10:00 PM ... 1810 Camp Fire “Council at the Grove” Educational demonstrations of Native American and soldier/militia/pioneer camp life

**Sunday, August 22** Breakfast served to reenactors at 8:00 AM; Target time for final clean-up of site is Noon.

Grouseland will be open for tours throughout the day, including Candlelight Tours from 7:00–10:00 PM during “Council at the Grove.”
