The case of Gotoimonana -- I do not speak Hawaiian -- Summers versus Elkhart Products Corporation, and in the case of Eloisa Aguilar Luna versus Golden Corral Corporation, I recommend that we uphold the finding of no probable cause in both of those.

I would say parenthetically that in the first of the two cases, the Summers versus Elkhart Products, I don't think that the person was treated fairly at all, but there's absolutely no evidence in the record that I could find of any national origin or racial animus, and therefore it's not our case. It shouldn't be a case -- it's not a case of discrimination, it's a case of unfairness in the workplace.

We're back on the record, and we have been joined by -- at 15 16 the very last moment, because we were just about to adjourn, we have our Executive Director, who 17 is ready to report. 18 19 MR. SMITH: Good morning, everyone. 20 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Good morning. 21 COMM. CRENSHAW: Good morning. 22 MR. SMITH: I apologize for that, being late to the Commission meeting. 23

Nothing of too much significance. I did want to highlight the annual report that we'll release at the beginning of the year. So, I'll be sending that out to, first, Madam Chair here within the week, and then to the rest of the Commission by extension, to make sure that we give an opportunity to have you guys review it before we send it out.

A few things to note in the report, and you'll see that when it comes out, we've been able to touch -- tangibly touch nearly 8,000 Hoosiers throughout the year. In our first year, when we started to increase our education and outreach, that number was a little over 5,000, which at that time was really good as well, but we've since then increased that to nearly 8,000. Our Web site touches have increased dramatically, to about 35,000 hits or views I believe it's monthly.

So, we're excited about a lot of the progress that we've made. All positive -- majority of positive feedback coming back from our surveys that we sent out from the statewide

diversity series as well as the CLE program that we put on. On a scale of 1 to 5, we averaged 4.4 and 4.38 respectively, so excited about that as well.

The only big events or agendas to -- or events to make mention of coming up in January, obviously, is our MLK event that we'll be having on the MLK holiday in conjunction with the MLK Commission. We'll have -- Mr. Gary Brackett will be the keynote speaker, former linebacker of the Indianapolis Colts. He will tell his story.

It'll be a two-part piece. We'll do the young people as well. They'll be at the State Museum, then they'll come over to the Statehouse, where we'll have the main ceremony there at the Statehouse. Of course, we partnered with IBE, where we'll give out a scholarship to a young person as one of the awards when we do the essay and the multimedia contest, and they'll talk about -- they'll depict, whether through essay or through art or through multimedia, about how they give back to their communities, and that winner will receive a \$500 scholarship, so we're excited

about that as well.

And then it's with a piece of sad news, obviously, that we announce the -- one, obviously, we talked about our Deputy Director, Mr. Brewster, who was leaving just shortly following the previous Commission meeting, and then it's with a bit of bittersweet news that we announce the retirement of our very own Judge Lange, who will be retiring and no longer with us as of December 26th. So, we want to, on record, after how many years of service?

MR. LANGE: Thirty-eight.

MR. SMITH: After 38 years of service, we want to definitely thank Judge for all of his hard work and service that he's given not only to the staff and the Commissioners, but the people of Indiana as well. So, if you get an opportunity after the Commission meeting today, we're going to formally say our goodbyes, but if you get an opportunity, please do so yourself.

Outside of that, I have nothing else to report. If you guys have any questions, I'll take those at this time.

1 CHAIRMAN CARTER: No. MR. SMITH: Hearing none, happy 2 3 holidays and Merry Christmas and all of that good 4 stuff to everyone, if I don't get an opportunity 5 to talk to you before then. 6 Thank you. 7 CHAIRMAN CARTER: Thank you. 8 And I guess -- does anyone have any 9 announcements? 10 (No response.) 11 CHAIRMAN CARTER: There are meeting 12 dates for next year on your agenda. If you would stay for signatures, and I'd reiterate our 13 14 Executive Director's thanks to Judge Lange, and 15 wish him well in the future, and relaxing times. 16 So, we're adjourned. 17 Thereupon, the proceedings of 18 December 14, 2012 were concluded at 12:00 o'clock p.m. 19 20 21
