FHIP/FHAP Common Issues

- Lack of funding!
- "Substantial Equivalency" with laws and procedure
- Retaining Good Workers on low salaries
- Power Imbalance between parties
- Harder to prove discrimination these days
- Leadership changes no consistency
- Backlog of Cases / Aging cases
- Lack of internal training
- > Staff not held to management expectations



Internal Management

- * Document Poor Performance
- * Issues to General Counsel & HR
- * Know the CBA; Talk to Union First
- * Be Fair; Lead by example
- * Create Reports that track productivity
- * Hold people accountable
- * Communicate with staff often

Final Thoughts

- * Complete your investigations timely (100 days for HUD; before your SOL runs in court)
- * Bang for Your Buck: 1 \$HUD case = 7 \$EEOC cases
- * Create a paid training program
- * Use your resources to get rid of the low hanging fruit (dicey cases)
- * Be prepared for the long haul
