I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The month of April included several important training events facilitated by INSOMM Program staff. INSOMM Program staff continued to assist the Department of Correction in the implementation of their Comprehensive Approaches to Sex Offender Management (CASOM) grant by providing several Static-99 training events to parole agents, probation officers, and community corrections personnel throughout the state. Additionally, INSOMM Program staff assisted the Department in coordinating the Stable 2007 training events provided by Dr. Andrew Harris at four locations across the state in late April. Based on feedback provided by attendees, the training events offered through the CASOM grant were an overwhelming success.

INSOMM Program Director, Adam Deming, presented at the Massachusetts Association for the Treatment of Sexual Abusers (MATSA) conference in early April. Dr. Deming's workshop focused on the development of collaborative relationships between public and private entities in the treatment and management of sexual offenders.

INSOMM Program Director Adam Deming, and Clinical Director Cari Rezman, continued their evaluation of the Sex Offender Treatment and Education Program (STEP) at the Pendleton Juvenile Correctional Facility in April. The evaluation will assess several areas of service provision currently provided by the STEP based on accepted standards of care in the field of juvenile sex offender treatment.

Both the total number of treatment eligible sex offenders housed at New Castle Correctional Facility and the number of sex offenders active in INSOMM Program sex offender treatment continues to increase. The INSOMM Program clinical staff at New Castle has done an excellent job of transitioning services from Miami and Plainfield Correctional Facilities to New Castle.

The INSOMM Program continues to await official word from the Indiana Department of Correction (IDOC) regarding the status of parole for juvenile sex offenders. Several juvenile sex offenders have been discharged from parole during the past two months, and those currently under parole supervision in the community are pending discharge within forty-five days of their release from IDOC facilities. The data contained in this report regarding INSOMM Program services to juvenile sex offenders on parole reflect these recent discharges and changes.

The INSOMM Program is pleased to announce that it will provide practicum training to its first practicum student. The student is currently enrolled at the University of Indianapolis, and will begin her practicum with the INSOMM Program in the fall of this year. Team Leader Kyle Shore will provide direct supervision to the Master's level practicum student. She will receive training in the assessment and treatment of adult male sex offenders in the IDOC's INSOMM Program at New Castle Correctional Facility.

III. QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

During the past month, efforts to improve the quality of services provided by the INSOMM Program have focused most heavily on the following areas:

- **Community Treatment Quality Assurance** – The INSOMM Program conducted a quality assurance audit on a Network Treatment Provider Agency in New Albany on April 17th. Results from the audit at this agency were rated as Provisionally Acceptable. The primary feedback that was given emphasized the need to ensure that (a) Initial Evaluation Reports and Bi-Annual

Progress Reports are submitted to the INSOMM Program main office in a timely fashion and (b) all agency files contain progress notes that are written by the provider and document relevant aspects of offender participation after each group session. The next Network Treatment Provider Quality Assurance Audit is scheduled to occur at an agency in Lawrenceburg on May 27, 2009.

- **Polygraph Quality Assurance** – In late April, three polygraph examinations conducted by INSOMM Program Network Polygraph Examiners were randomly selected to be audited during the third quarter of this fiscal year. Letters were sent to the polygraph examiners who conducted the selected exams to request that they submit all needed materials for auditing within 10 business days.
- **Annual Aggregate Recidivism Analyses** – Efforts were initiated on 4-27-09 to begin updating the INSOMM Program aggregate recidivism database to include all INSOMM Program offenders who have been released to parole since 1999 through the end of calendar year 2008. Updated data pertaining to each offender's conviction history since their institutional release will be gathered across the next several months. Once data collection is complete, updated aggregate recidivism analyses will be conducted. Results from these analyses will be reported in the INSOMM Program Annual Report to be released in November 2009.

IV. PERSONNEL / HUMAN RESOURCES

There are currently two INSOMM Program counselor vacancies, both at New Castle Correctional Facility. One counselor position was filled in the month of April. The INSOMM Program is pleased to announce that Jennifer Christman is the most recent addition to the INSOMM Program counseling staff at New Castle. Jennifer will begin working with the INSOMM Program on June 1, 2009. Interviewing for vacant INSOMM Program positions will continue in the month of May, and it is anticipated that all vacant positions will be filled in either May or June.

V. GOALS AND UPCOMING EVENTS

Goals for the month of May, 2009 include the following:

- Recruit for, interview, and fill all open INSOMM Program staff positions.
- Schedule Phase III Network Treatment Provider audits to be conducted in June of this year.
- Make final preparations for the Annual INSOMM Program Training Conference to be held on June 29 and 30, 2009.
- Adam Deming and Cari Rezman will complete their evaluation of the STEP at Pendleton Juvenile Correctional Facility, and will present their findings to the Indiana Department of Correction administrative staff at Pendleton.

Upcoming events for the INSOMM Program include:

- An INSOMM Program Management Committee Meeting is scheduled for Monday May 4, 2009 at 10am. The meeting will be held at the INSOMM Program Main Office in downtown Indianapolis.
- INSOMM Program Director Adam Deming will present at the Indiana Correctional Association's conference on May 29, 2009.
