



# Liberty Behavioral Health Corporation Indiana Sex Offender Management and Monitoring Program Monthly Utilization and Status Report

May 31, 2008

## I. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

An Indiana Sex Offender Management and Monitoring (INSOMM) Program Management Committee Meeting was held on May 5, 2008. The majority of the meeting time was used to discuss the issue of which offenders within the Indiana Department of Correction can or should qualify as "INSOMM Program Offenders." Issues relating to statutory language, clinically appropriate treatment, efficient use of resources, and how to "flag" offenders in the IDOC system were discussed. Some agreement was reached regarding the importance of sticking with the statutory language as an indicator of those offenders who should be targeted for treatment. It was agreed that the sub-committee designated to address this important issue would reconvene, resolve outstanding questions, and report back to the Program Management Committee at its next meeting.

Melissa Gharst, INSOMM Program Assistant Director, met during the month with Sally Stephenson, Assistant Superintendent at Miami Correctional Facility, and John George, Assistant Superintendent at Plainfield Correctional Facility. These meetings were arranged in an effort to provide information regarding the placement classes provided by the INSOMM Program District Re-Entry and Resource Coordinators. Thus far, although offenders have been attending and benefiting from these classes, INSOMM Program staff have identified problem areas that are having an impact on the efficiency and effectiveness of this service. Additional meetings between INSOMM Program and IDOC staff to address these problems have been scheduled.

Dr. Deming and Ms. Gharst continue to meet with INSOMM Program Phase III Network Treatment Providers throughout the state. On May 30, 2008 they traveled to Fort Wayne, Indiana and provided training to several clinical staff at the Bowen Center. The training was provided to staff members at the Bowen Center that are in the process of becoming credentialed as INSOMM Program Network Treatment Providers. The Training provided an orientation to the INSOMM Program and also focused on clinical interviewing of sexual offenders.

The INSOMM Program Staff Retreat was held at McCormick's Creek State Park on May 22 and 23. Events at the retreat focused on activities designed to enhance team building and communication among the staff. Kyle Shore, INSOMM Program Team Leader at Plainfield Correctional Facility, was awarded the "INSOMM Program Employee of the Year."

\*\*\*\*Eighteen of these offenders moved to the Re-Entry Unit at PCF before completing risk-based treatment. Six of these offenders failed to complete treatment due to early release to the community. Four were approved to participate in the Plus Program at PCF and will be returned to INSOMM Program treatment after participating in the Plus Program. Three offenders were removed from treatment due to disruptive behavior, two were removed after denying their offenses and refusing to take a polygraph exam, and one was removed due to refusal to participate. Code 116 conduct reports were written on these latter six offenders for failure to participate in mandatory facility-based treatment. An additional two offender were removed from programming due to placement in segregation, and one additional offender was removed due to mental illness that made him unable to benefit from treatment.

### III. QUALITY IMPROVEMENT

During the past month, efforts to improve the quality of services provided by the INSOMM Program have focused most heavily on the following areas:

- **Monitoring Contract Compliance and Performance Indicators** – In mid-May the Quality Assurance / Quality Improvement (QA/QI) Committee began preparing for a program review by the IDOC. As part of these efforts, revisions and updates were made to the contract monitoring tool that is used to evaluate contractual compliance and performance. The majority of revisions to the contract monitoring tool were made to accommodate program enhancements that were added to the contract last fall through joint agreement between Liberty Behavioral Health (LBH) and IDOC. These revisions were reviewed and approved by Dr. William Elliott, Director of Mental Health and Behavioral Management for the IDOC. Efforts were also initiated in May to begin gathering and organizing of materials for documenting compliance with items on the contract monitoring tool. The next quarterly QA/QI Committee Meeting is scheduled for June 2, 2008 and will be used to inventory these materials and to determine if any additional documents / materials are needed for the program review. Official dates for the review have not yet been set. The INSOMM Program Management Committee will discuss this at its next meeting on June 12, 2008 and will attempt to schedule the review for some time in June or July, 2008. There are plans for the INSOMM Program Quality Assurance and Research Coordinator to conduct an internal program review, prior to the program review conducted by IDOC. Dates for this will be scheduled once the IDOC program review dates are set.
  
- **INSOMM Program Recidivism Analyses** – Efforts were initiated in March to collect and analyze data from a cohort of INSOMM Program Offenders who released from IDOC facilities in 2004. The primary goal of these efforts is to determine what percentage of those offenders were returned to an IDOC facility within 3 years of their institutional release. The chosen time frame for this analysis is based on the standard IDOC recidivism definition that focuses on the 3-year window following release. The overarching goal of this project is to make future INSOMM Program Outcome Reports more consistent with the format and language used by the IDOC Research and Planning Division in reporting recidivism data. This project remains on-going at this time.

### IV. PERSONNEL / HUMAN RESOURCES

There are currently two staff vacancies within the INSOMM Program, a Counselor 1 position at Plainfield Correctional Facility, and a Counselor 1 position for treatment services provided at both Plainfield Correctional Facility and Rockville Correctional Facility.

Dr. Tracey Fintel has announced her intention to resign the Clinical Director position, and return to a Counselor 1 position at Plainfield Correctional Facility, effective June 16, 2008. Additionally, Hope Hadding has been hired into the Counselor 1 position that provides INSOMM Program services at both Rockville Correctional Facility and Plainfield Correctional Facility, and will begin with the INSOMM Program on June 9, 2008.

With these changes in staffing, both of the Counselor 1 positions that are currently vacant will be filled in June, and the Clinical Director position will become vacant on June 16. Liberty Behavioral Health has begun the process of recruiting a new Clinical Director, and interviews are scheduled to begin in June.

## **V. GOALS AND UPCOMING EVENTS**

Goals for the month of June, 2008 include the following:

- Recruit for, interview, and fill the Clinical Director position that will become vacant following the resignation of Tracey Fintel.
- Dr. Deming, INSOMM Program Director, and Melissa Gharst, INSOMM Program Assistant Director, will visit with at least one INSOMM Program Network Treatment Provider agency, at their offices, to review and discuss quality assurance issues.
