

## Disaster Recovery Plan

### Manufacturing Plants and Ingredient Suppliers

Mead Johnson & Company, LLC's (Mead Johnson) formulas are manufactured in several different plants operated by Mead Johnson or by third parties in several states as well as in several international locations.

Mead Johnson plants that provide product are operated in the U.S. at the following locations:

Mead Johnson has other contract manufacturers that can provide product if needed. These manufacturers are located in diverse areas of the country to mitigate the impact of any natural disasters that would impact one part of the country. Due to the confidential and proprietary nature of the locations of our contract manufacturers, the details regarding their locations cannot be provided.

Mead Johnson also operates plants in other countries for manufacturing infant formulas for other geographic markets. In the event of an emergency that prevents the manufacture of products at one or more of the U.S. plants, Mead Johnson would implement steps to transfer production to one or more other plants outside of the U.S.

In the event of a large-scale product recall or other event that impacts ongoing production of formula, Mead Johnson would implement the following plan:

(1) Assess locational impacts of product recall or other disrupting event and draw supply from those facilities that are not impacted by the supply issues. Mead Johnson intentionally reserves a planned amount of capacity at each manufacturing facility that can be enacted in case of such issues. Mead Johnson has a specific business continuity plan in place which involves specific designated individuals across multiple areas of the company, including WIC, being in constant communication and determining and reallocating supplies and shipments as needed. Mead Johnson has committed to making its products available to WIC population in its contracted States a top priority so that any excess supply would be diverted to Mead Johnson's WIC Contract States as a matter of first priority.

(2) In the event of transportation disruption, Mead Johnson has contracts in place with many different carriers across various modes of transportation, including, air, sea, rail, and road. Mead Johnson has a designated team committed to constantly assessing travel needs and impacts. The WIC contacts listed below are in direct communication with these assets to ensure continued supply into Mead Johnson's WIC Contract States.

Mead Johnson has risk mitigation plans in place for ingredients it purchases for its formulas. In the event of an emergency that prevents a supplier from being able to provide ingredients from one plant, Mead Johnson would implement steps to transfer its procurement of such ingredients to another plant or a different supplier. Mead Johnson's suppliers are located in diverse areas of the country. The location and names of these suppliers is confidential and proprietary. Therefore, details about these suppliers cannot be provided. However, Mead Johnson has in place contracts with multiple suppliers for its ingredients. As part of these contracts, the supplier has to meet certain requirements including compliance with all applicable FDA and USDA requirements. Mead Johnson's Quality Control Team audits all suppliers on a regular basis to ensure compliance and that products meet specifications.

## **II. Distribution Centers and Points**

In the event of an emergency, product for will be provided from the Mead Johnson Distribution Centers located in Mt. Vernon, IN, Las Vegas, NV and Myerstown, PA. Mead Johnson takes steps to ensure that these facilities have extra capacity and the ability to receive additional supply in the event of an increase in demand.

Each of Mead Johnson's plants, distribution centers and suppliers are serviced by multiple transportation modes, including LTL, truck and Intermodal as well as next day air for emergency cases. In the event of an emergency preventing the use of one route of transportation for supply of ingredients or shipment of finished product, Mead Johnson can implement steps to rely on alternative modes of transportation such as inter-modal rail and air cargo. These alternate modes of transportation can be arranged within 24 to 48 hours should an emergency occur.

## **III. Emergency Contact and Action Plan**
