PROJECT BY THE INDIANA FINANCE AUTHORITY

SEALED PROPOSALS FOR: **New Cabins at Abe Martin Lodge, Brown County State Park**

will be received by the Indiana Finance Authority, at 402 West Washington Street, Room W299, Indianapolis, Indiana 46204 until **1:30 pm** (local time), on **October 2, 2014**. All bids will be publicly opened and read aloud. Indiana Finance Authority (IFA) reserves the right to reject any and all bids.

If the valuation of this project is \$150,000 or more, bids shall be accepted only from bidders who hold a valid Certificate of Qualification from the State Certification Board, Public Works Division, Department of Administration, in accordance with 25 Indiana Administrative Code (IAC) 2-4-2 for the following classifications of work:

1542.01 – General Contractors / Institutional

Bidders are required to provide a Bid Bond or certified check with its bid that complies with the requirements contained in the Bidding Documents.

A pre-bid conference and site visit are scheduled for **1:00 pm** (local time), on **September 18, 2014** at **Abe Martin Lodge, Brown County State Park, Nashville, IN**. **Vintage Archonics** (“Designer”) will conduct the pre-bid conference and site visit. Attendance at the pre-bid and site visit is highly recommended for all bidders for this project.

Bids must be submitted in accordance with the Bidding Documents. Bidding documents prepared by **Vintage Archonics** will be available at **Eastern Engineering, 1239 North Wells Street, Fort Wayne, IN, 46808; Phone (260) 426-3119**. A complete set of **electronic bidding documents will be available for a deposit of \$68.00 which is 100% non-refundable**.

Failure to provide a completed M/WBE Participation Plan and Good Faith Efforts Worksheet at the time of bid submission may result in disqualification and rejection of the bid. Please note that IFA and/or the IDOA reserves the right to verify all information included on a M/WBE Participation Plan and Good Faith Efforts Worksheets before making final determinations of the bidder’s responsiveness.

Additionally, the M/WBE Participation Plan must show that there are minority owned enterprises and women owned enterprises participating in the contract. The participation can be, but is not limited to, a subcontractor or second tier participation with common suppliers such as office supplies, courier services and/or janitorial services. The M/WBE Participation Plan must indicate the names of the minority and women owned firms that will participate in the award, a contact name and phone number, the work or service to be supplied and the specific dollar amount from the contract to be awarded that will be directed toward each firm.

The bidder is expected to demonstrate a good faith effort to meet the participation goal of 7 % for minority owned business participation and 5% for women owned business participation. A good faith effort consists of documenting the effort that was made to achieve these goals in accordance with the M/WBE Policy. Bidders are encouraged to contact and work with the Minority Business and Women's Enterprise Division of the Indiana Department of Administration to design a plan to meet established goals. The bidder is expected to demonstrate a good faith effort to meet the participation goal of 3 % for veteran owned business participation. A good faith effort consists of documenting the effort that was


