**RE: 2012 Madison County Juvenile Detention Center Inspection**  
**Conducted: July 2012**

Dear Judge Pancol:

As required by 210 IAC 6, an inspection of the Madison County Juvenile Detention Center's operation was conducted on July 18, 2012. The inspection was conducted by Tom Hanlon, Vanessa Krause, Shannon Bowling and Esther Hinton.

The Madison County Juvenile Detention Center is operated by the Madison County Superior Court, and is located at 3420 Mounds Road, In Anderson, Indiana 46017. The Madison County Juvenile Detention Center is a 32-bed juvenile detention facility primarily serving Madison County. The Detention Manager is Leshea Cates and the Director of the Madison County Youth Center is Gary Williams.

This inspection constitutes the fifteenth -annual inspection of the Madison County Juvenile Detention Center. Compliance with all the mandatory standards and at least 90 % of the recommended standards is required to attain "full compliance" as outlined by 210 IAC 6-3. The inspection included a tour of the facility, review of all mandatory and recommended standards, and interviews with the detention staff and residents. Detention staff interviewed was well versed in policy and procedures, and were supportive of administrative staff. Residents interviewed offered no instances of abuse, and no complaints about conditions were noted.

Listed below are recommended standards that were found to be in non-compliance:

210 IAC 6 Standard#	Remarks
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3-1.8 Written policy, procedure, and practice provide that there exists a community advisory committee, representative of the community that serves as a link between the program and the community.

**No community advisory board exists.**

Summary of Tour:

- Facility was well maintained.
- A few items out of date in freezer were addressed immediately when found.
- Recreation area had a lot of opportunities.
- There are a lot of books in education area.

Review of Folders:

- Folders were very well organized, easy to read and review.

The detention center was found to be in compliance with 100 % of all mandatory standards, and 99.6 % of recommended standards. A certificate of "Full-Compliance" will accompany this report which will become public information ten days after mailing.
