

Executive Summary
April 2008

Tables 1 and 2

- Offenders from the Arizona Department of Corrections housed at the New Castle Correctional Facility are beginning to be transferred out of the facility in order to meet capacity requirements for Indiana offenders.

Tables 1 and 2

- Marion Co. Re-Entry Center/Duvall Center has begun to receive offenders who are eligible for work release and who reside in Central Indiana.

- Since peaking in June 2007 with an average daily population of 186 juvenile female offenders, the monthly average daily population in April 2008 has decreased approximately 15%, to 159 juvenile female offenders.

Indiana Department of Correction Population Summary

- There were 25,261 adult male offenders (including 1,773 county jail “back-ups” and 134 in contracted beds) on April 30, 2008. This population is 2% above the operational bed capacity.

- There were 2,361 adult female offenders (including 124 county jail “back-ups” and 66 in contracted beds) on April 30, 2008. This population is 1% above the operational bed capacity.

- There were 822 juvenile male offenders in the Department’s facilities on April 30, 2008. This population is 16% below the operational bed capacity.

- There were 156 juvenile female offenders in the Department’s facilities on April 30, 2008. This population is 22% below the operational bed capacity.

- There were 9,502 adult males on parole in Indiana (8,746 Indiana parolees and 756 other jurisdiction parolees) on April 30, 2008.

- There were 1,317 adult females on parole in Indiana (1,212 Indiana parolees and 105 other jurisdiction parolees) on April 30, 2008.

- There were 315 juvenile males on parole in Indiana (296 Indiana parolees and 19 other jurisdiction parolees) on April 30, 2008.

- There were 54 juvenile females on parole in Indiana (53 Indiana parolees and 1 other jurisdiction parolees) on April 30, 2008.

Definitions

For the purpose of this report, the following definitions apply:

Admission – The means by which an offender enters the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of the return of an escapee, this does not include a return from a temporary absence.

Average Daily Population – The sum of the daily beginning counts for a month, divided by that month's number of daily beginning counts.

Beginning Count – The number of offenders physically present at the beginning of the day (ie, 0000:01 hours).

Class A Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of thirty years, with not more than twenty years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class B Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of ten years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than four years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class C Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of four years, with not more than four years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than two years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Class D Felony – An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of one and one-half years, with not more than one and one-half years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than one year subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

County Jail "Back-ups" (Jail Bed Count) – Those offenders who have been committed to the Indiana Department of Correction, but are housed in a county jail until they can be transferred to a Department of Correction intake facility. The county receives \$35.00 per day, per offender, to house these offenders.

Ending Count – The number of offenders physically present at the end of the day (ie, 2400:00 hours).

Felon – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for more than one year.

Level 1 Security Classification – Minimum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 1 have the least restrictive security measures in place.

Level 2 Security Classification – Medium security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 2 have a moderate degree of security measures in place.

Level 3 Security Classification – Maximum security level. Facilities which are designated as Level 3 have very restrictive security measures in place.

Misdemeanant – A person convicted in any jurisdiction who might have been imprisoned for not more than one year.

Murder - An offense whereby a person convicted of this felony shall be imprisoned for a fixed term of fifty-five years, with not more than ten years added for aggravating circumstances, or not more than ten years subtracted for mitigating circumstances.

Operational Capacity – The total bed capacity of the facility. The capacity of a facility is the number of beds authorized for safe and efficient operation of the facility.

Pre-Dispositional – An individual ordered by the Court to the Indiana Department of Correction for evaluation prior to sentencing.

Release – The means by which an offender leaves the custody or jurisdiction of the Indiana Department of Correction. For this report, with the exception of an escape, this does not include a temporary absence.

Safekeeper – An individual whom the Court has determined to be in imminent danger of serious bodily injury or death, or who represents a substantial threat to the safety of others, and whom the Court has ordered to the Indiana Department of Correction for custody and security control.

Secure Confinement Units – Denotes maximum control with the most restrictive security measures in place.

Vacancy – The number of beds available for assignment.



Fiscal Year 2008






Adult Males Held in County Jails




