



American Recovery & Reinvestment Act (ARRA) Leaking Underground Storage Tank (LUST) Trust Fund

Soil and groundwater delineation and remediation. Estimated cost: \$140,000

Background

The site is currently occupied by the West Lebanon Volunteer Fire Department and was formally a retail gasoline station. In 1998 three underground storage tanks (USTs) containing gasoline were removed and sampling showed that residual contamination remained in the groundwater. An additional three USTs, two containing gasoline and one waste oil were removed at the time and soil was stockpiled on site. However, no soil or groundwater sampling was conducted relating to USTs that had been closed in place.

Current Status

The goal of the Indiana Brownfields Program is to complete delineation by sampling soil and groundwater and conduct remediation on the subject property to achieve a No Further Action designation. On October 13, 2009, eight soil and five groundwater samples were taken at the site. A soil stockpile located on site was also sampled for contamination. Sampling results are pending.
