EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Commissioner Herndon.

COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Here.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Commissioner McClain.

COMMISSIONER McCLAIN: Here.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you.

Commissioners, have you all had a chance to review the minutes from the prior meeting?

Are there any additions or corrections to the minutes?

Hearing none, what is your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Move to approve.
COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded, thank you, to approve the minutes from the previous meeting.

All in favor, please signify by saying aye. (Chorus of ayes.)

The motion passed on the previous minutes. Thank you.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: All right. Good afternoon, everyone, and thank you, Mr. Chair. Our apologies for being a few minutes late. We were devouring some Shapiro's lunch, so, anyway, thank you for your patience.

To start off, I have four new staff members I'd like to introduce.

Racheal Burger. Stand, Racheal. She's recently joined the investigations division as our newest background investigator. She has a bachelor's degree in political science and

Spanish from the University of Indianapolis, brings 20 years of working in the criminal justice field to the IGC, and was a probation officer in Marion County for the last 13 years. So welcome, Racheal.

Sarah Nevins, there she is back there, just recently joined the charity gaming division as a program coordinator. She started with the State three years ago at the Department of Workforce Development and just a shy year later she was promoted at DWE, and then we were able to steal her over here, so welcome, Sarah.

Amy Willoughby. Amy just joined the IGC this week as the law enforcement division's administrative assistant. She was most recently the office manager for Indiana Homeland Security Emergency Operations Center. Prior to that she worked at the BMV and also AGO Stout Field, so welcome, Amy.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Amy's going to present today, is that right?

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Yes. Yeah.
And Josie Conrad, stand, she also started this week, and she is the new executive administrative assistant. She was previously
with Washington Township as their administrator for over 15 years, so welcome, Josie.

I'm also pleased to announce three
promotions. Kimi Simpson was recently -- Kimi -was recently promoted from our occupational licensing coordinator to the gaming agent administrator position, but she's keeping both jobs and doing them both, so I think congratulations, Kimi.

And last but not least, assistant supervisor Anthony Edwards was promoted to supervisor at Majestic Star Casino, and Joe Cinko was promoted to be the assistant supervisor at Majestic Star, so congratulations to both Anthony and Joe.

These promotions were the result of the retirement of the former supervisor, Johnnie Hudson. And Supervisor Hudson did an exceptional job at Majestic Star, and we thank him for his service and wish him a very happy retirement.

Since the September meeting, Commission staff has added 35 individuals to the Exclusion List and 5 waivers were granted to the casinos. More detailed information was provided to the Commissioners and will be posted on our website. Our investigations division has completed
reinvestigations of three suppliers: American Gaming System, Data Financial and Global Surveillance. These reports are included in your confidential materials, and Directors Leek and Brown are present should you have any questions.

And that concludes my report, if there are any questions.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you very much.

Next I'd like to administer an oath to everyone who may speak before the Commission today. If you'd kindly please stand and raise your right hand and remain standing after the oath, if you would.

Do you solemnly swear, subject to the penalties of perjury, that all statements that you may make today before the Indiana Gaming Commission will be the truth and nothing but the truth, so help you God?

Thank you. Please remain standing. I want to go around and have everybody state their name for the record, please. We'll start with you.

MR. McINTOSH: Trent McIntosh.
MR. BAUMANN: Ron Baumann.
MR. DOUGLASS: Ben Douglass.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you very much. You may be seated.

Is there any old business to come before the Commission today?

No? Hearing none, new business.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: So we will start with patron matters, and Stephanie Gardner.

MS. GARDNER: Good afternoon, Commissioners and the Executive Staff. You have before you 28 orders regarding the Voluntary Exclusion Program. Pursuant to the rules of the program, the
identities of the VEP participants must remain confidential.

Pursuant to 68 IAC \(6-3-1(9)\), a participant in the program agrees that if he or she violates the terms of the program and enters the gaming area of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission, they will forfeit any jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager.

Under Orders 2018-166 through 2018-193, a total sum of \(\$ 92,813.11\) was forfeited by John Does 57 through 84. These winnings were collected at Ameristar, Blue Chip, French Lick, Hollywood, Hoosier Park, Horseshoe Hammond, Horseshoe Southern, Indiana Grand, Majestic Star and Tropicana. These winnings were held as required by Commission regulations.

Mr. Chair, this concludes my presentation. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you very much, Stephanie. Any questions for Stephanie?

Hearing none, Commissioners, what's your pleasure?

COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Orders 166 through 193.

CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Thank you.
COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve motions -- or Orders 166 through 193.

Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor of the motion, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
The motion passes unanimously. Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Moving on to VEP forfeitures, Dustin Moloy.

And, Commissioners, I'd ask that you be kind to Dustin because he might be a little tired since today's his first day back after having a new baby girl two weeks ago.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Congratulations.
MR. MOLOY: Thank you. Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: We'll see if he's coherent.

MR. MOLOY: Yeah, my brain's a little foggy, but we'll see if we can get there.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: I thought it was 2016, Dustin.

MR. MOLOY: Yeah, that's right.
Okay. Good afternoon. Members of the

Commission, you have before you Order 2018-194 regarding a settlement reached in lieu of administrative proceedings of a VEP forfeiture appeal. This order relates to John Doe 17-79, whose remittance of winnings was approved by the Commission in Order 2017-18. In this case, Commission staff offered to settle the matter by refunding a portion of the moneys seized in exchange for the VEP participant withdrawing his appeal.

The VEP participant agreed to the terms and executed a settlement agreement.

Approving Order 2018-194 would have the effect of approving the settlement agreement between Commission staff and the VEP participant.

If you have any questions, I'd be happy to answer them.

Commissioners, any questions for Dustin?
What is your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Order 194.

COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved
and seconded to approve Order 2018-194.
Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor of the motion, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
The motion passes unanimously.
Thanks, Dustin.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Please continue.
MR. MOLOY: Members of the Commission, you have before you Order 2018-195 regarding William Dehaven Jr.'s appeal of his placement on the statewide exclusion list.

Dehaven was placed on the statewide exclusion list on November 8, 2017. Dehaven timely submitted an appeal, and an Administrative Law Judge was appointed to the matter. After Commission staff filed a motion for summary judgment and Dehaven filed a response, on October 2, 2018, the Administrative Law Judge issued findings of fact, conclusions of law and a recommended order granting summary judgment in favor of the Commission. Dehaven timely objected to the recommended order.

Approving Order 2018-195 would adopt the

Administrative Law Judge's findings of fact, conclusions of law and recommended order.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Moving on to suppliers.

MR. MOLOY: Commissioners, you have before you Order 2018-196. Pursuant to Indiana Code Section 4-33-7-8 and 68 IAC Section 2-2-8, a supplier's license must be renewed each year along with payment of a \(\$ 7,500\) renewal fee. Each
of the following licensees has submitted a timely request for renewal along with the required payment: Aristocrat Technologies, Inc., American Gaming Systems, LLC, and Cummins-Allison Corp. Approving Order 2018-196 would have the effect of renewing the license of each of the respective licensees for a period of one year. Thank you.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you, Dustin. Any questions for Dustin?

What's the Commission's pleasure?
COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Move to approve Order 196.

COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve proposed Order 2018-196.

Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Passes unanimously.
Thank you, Dustin.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Thank you.
COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Dustin, I figure you
might need some additional sugar, so here's a cookie for you.

MR. MOLOY: Appreciate it.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: And moving to supplier disciplinary actions, Caitlin Hannah.

MS. HANNAH: Good afternoon, Commissioners and Executive Staff. You have before you five settlement agreements concerning disciplinary actions against licensed suppliers.

Order 2018-197 is a settlement agreement with Cummins-Allison Corporation that includes two counts wherein the supplier failed to notify the Commission of three terminations and failed to renew a Level 2 occupational license in a timely manner.

Cummins-Allison Corporation agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 3,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action, \(\$ 3,000\) for count \(I\) and \(\$ 500\) for Count II.

Order 2018-198 and Order 2018-201 are settlement agreements with Data Financial and IGT wherein the suppliers violated the rules of shipping electronic gaming device hardware and software.

Data Financial and IGT agreed to a monetary
settlement of \(\$ 1,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-199 is a settlement agreement with Everi Games wherein the supplier failed to renew two Level 2 occupational licenses in a timely manner.

Everi Games agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 1,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-202 is a settlement agreement with North American Video wherein the supplier failed to notify the Commission that the Director of Operations position has been filled and failed to submit a Level 1 license application for this position in a timely manner.

North American Video agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 4,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Mr. Chair, this concludes my presentation.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you.
Any questions for Caitlin?
Commissioners, what's your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Orders 197 through 202, and 200 being noted as withdrawn.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: So noted. Is there a
second?
COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve proposed Orders 2018-197 through 199 and 201 and 202.

Is there any further discussion on the motion?

Hearing none, all in favor, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Thank you. Passed unanimously.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: And moving on to occupational license matters, Alyssa Servies.

MS. SERVIES: Good afternoon, members of the Commission. You have before you Orders 2018-203 through 2018-207 concerning settlement agreements between Commission staff and occupational licensees. Each of these licensees failed to comply with Indiana Administrative Code Title 68 Sections 2-3-9.

In lieu of disciplinary action, Commission staff offered each of these licensees a settlement agreement that would have them agree to an unpaid, voluntary relinquishment of their
license for a period of regularly scheduled working days, with no vacation or other paid time off to be used.

Each of these licensees has agreed to the terms of the settlement agreement. And detailed information regarding each applicant's investigation is contained in confidential materials that have been provided to the Commission.

Approval of Orders 2018-203 through 2018-207 would have the effect of approving the settlement agreements.

CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Thank you.

COMMISSIONER SAXON: Move to approve Order 2018-203 through 2018-207.

COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve Order 2018-203 through 207.

Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor of the motion,
please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Thank you. Motion passes unanimously.
MS. SERVIES: Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Thank you.
MS. SERVIES: Members of the Commission, as of this morning, Order 2018-208 has been withdrawn.

Therefore, you have before you Order 2018-209, which denies an application for a occupational license to work in Indiana casinos. Pursuant to Indiana Code Section 4-33-8-3, an occupational license may not be issued to a individual unless he or she has met the standards adopted by the Commission for holding an occupational license.

An applicant for a Level 2 or Level 3 occupational license must include the applicant's criminal history in his or her application. Any misrepresentation or omission made with respect to the application may be grounds for the denial of the application pursuant to Indiana Administrative Code Title 68 Section 2-3-4(b)(2).

As part of the routine background
investigation into each applicant, the Commission staff discovered that the applicant represented in Order 2018-209 failed to meet the established standards for licensure. The applicant was given an opportunity to withdraw his application from consideration for permanent licensure.

Detailed information regarding the applicant's investigation is contained in confidential materials provided to the Commission.

Approval of Order 2018-209 would have the effect of denying an occupational license to work in Indiana casinos.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Any questions?
What is your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Order 209, with the Order 208 noted as withdrawn.

COMMISSIONER HERNDON: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve Order 2018-209.

Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Thank you. Motion passes unanimously.
MS. SERVIES: Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: We now move on to casino matters. We'll start with disciplinary actions, and Angela Bunton.

MS. BUNTON: Good afternoon, Commissioners and Executive Staff. You have before you 11 settlement agreements concerning disciplinary actions.

Order 2018-210 is a settlement agreement with Ameristar East Chicago and it includes four counts wherein the casino failed to timely notify the Commission of two terminations, violated the rules on live gaming device fills, violated the rules and internal control procedures for the soft count process by failing to properly investigate a variance and forcing a balance, and violating the rules and internal control procedures for child support arrears delinquency reporting.

Ameristar has agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 69,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-211 is a settlement agreement with Belterra Casino and includes two counts wherein the casino violated the rules on a live gaming device fill and violated the rules and internal control procedures on child support arrears delinquency reporting.

Belterra agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 42,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-212 is a settlement agreement with Blue Chip Casino and includes three counts wherein the casino failed to timely notify the Commission of two terminations, a sensitive key violation and that a Voluntarily Excluded Program participant had been found on property. The casino also violated the rules and internal control procedures on child support arrears delinquency reporting.

Blue Chip agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 43,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-213 is a settlement agreement with French Lick Resort Casino and includes two counts wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures for issuing markers at the table game, for the shuffling procedures at mini-baccarat and for the child support
arrears delinquency reporting.
French Lick agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 43,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-214 is a settlement agreement with Hoosier Park wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures for child support arrearage delinquency reporting.

Hoosier Park agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 22,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-215 is a settlement agreement with Horseshoe Hammond and includes two counts wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures for child support arrearage delinquency reporting and allowed an underage person on the casino floor.

Horseshoe agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 41,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-216 is a settlement agreement with Horseshoe South and includes two counts wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures for child support arrearage delinquency reporting and violated the rules for live gaming device fills.

Horseshoe South agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 43,000\) in lieu of disciplinary
action.
Order 2018-217 is a settlement agreement with Indiana Grand and includes six counts wherein the casino failed to timely notify the Commission of a termination, violated the rules for manually paid jackpots and coin-testing electronic gaming devices, violated the rules and internal control procedures on child support arrears delinquency reporting, violated the rules of the soft count room by allowing two unauthorized individuals and a cell phone into the soft count room, violated the rules of the bill validator drop by allowing a non-drop team member to walk through the drop zone, and allowed an underage person on the casino floor. Indiana Grand agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 19,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-218 is a settlement agreement with Majestic Star Casino and includes four counts wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures for child support arrearage delinquency reporting, allowed an underage person on the casino floor, violated the rules for live gaming device fills, and violated the surveillance rules.

Majestic Star agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 18,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-219 is a settlement agreement with Rising Star Casino wherein the casino violated the internal control procedures for the bill validator drop process.

Rising Star agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 1,500\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Order 2018-220 is a settlement agreement with Tropicana Evansville and includes five counts wherein the casino violated the rules and internal control procedures on the child support arrearage delinquency reporting, allowed an underage person on the casino floor on two separate occasions, violated the rules of shuffling -- on shuffling playing cards with an automatic card shuffler, violated the rules on live gaming device fills and violated the rules on electronic gaming devices by installing an incorrect reel strip.

Tropicana agreed to a monetary settlement of \(\$ 57,000\) in lieu of disciplinary action.

Mr. Chair, this concludes my presentation. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Okay. Thank you.

Hearing none, what's your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Orders 210 through 220.

COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve Orders 2018-210 through 220.

All in favor of the motion, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Motion passes unanimously. Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Now to casino renewals. Dustin.

MR. MOLOY: Commissioners, you have before you Order 2018-221 regarding the renewal of the casino owner's license for Belterra Resort Indiana, LLC; Order \(2018-222\) regarding the renewal of the casino owner's license for Indiana Gaming Company, LLC, d/b/a Hollywood Casino Lawrenceburg; Order 2018-223 regarding the renewal of the casino owner's license for Caesars Riverboat Casino, LLC, d/b/a Horseshoe Casino Hotel Southern Indiana; and Order 2018-224
regarding the renewal of the casino owner's license for Aztar Indiana Gaming Company, LLC, d/b/a Tropicana Evansville.

All four casino licensees have filed the proper paperwork and paid their respective renewal fees. Belterra, Horseshoe South and Tropicana's licenses were set to expire on October 22, 2018, November 15, 2018, and December 4, 2018, respectively, but Executive Director Tait issued interim renewals to each to cover the period between the licenses' expiration and this business meeting. Hollywood's license is set to expire on December 9, 2018.

By Order 2018-121, the Commission approved the transfer of ownership interest for Belterra from Pinnacle Entertainment, Inc., to Boyd Gaming Corporation, conditioned on Boyd submitting an updated written power of attorney identifying a trustee-in-waiting for Belterra upon the transaction's closing. On October 25, 2018, Boyd indicated in writing that it desired to have Mr. Maunty Collins take over as trustee-in-waiting, which was thereafter approved by Executive Director Tait.

Additionally, by Orders 2017-211, 2018-58
and 2018-55, the Commission approved the written power of attorneys for Horseshoe South, Tropicana and Hollywood respectively.

These approvals expire upon the renewal of the casino owner's license. For that reason, all casinos must request renewal of the Commission's approval of the written power of attorney concurrently with the request for renewal, or present the Commission with a new written power of attorney naming a new trustee-in-waiting. Each licensee has stated their intent to maintain their existing trustee-in-waiting and has not presented the Commission with any modifications to their power of attorney.

Approving Orders 2018-221 through Order 2018-224 would have the effect of renewing the license of each of the respective licensees for a period of one year.

Thank you.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you.
Any questions for Dustin?
Hearing none, what's your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Orders 221 through 224.

COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Second.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve Orders 221 through 224 . Any further discussion on the motion? Hearing none, all in favor of the motion, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
The motion carries unanimously. Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Moving on to casino financings, Dennis Mullen.

MR. MULLEN: Thank you. Good afternoon, Commissioners and Executive Staff. You have before you Orders 2018-225 and 226, each concerning a request for approval of a proposed financial transaction. Order 225 concerns a request submitted by Blue Sky, LLC, which operates French Lick Resorts, and Order 226 concerns a request submitted by Caesars Entertainment Corporation, which is the parent company of the entities that operate Hoosier Park, Indiana Grand, Horseshoe Hammond and Horseshoe Southern Casinos.

Pursuant to Indiana Code Articles 4-33 and 4-35 and Title 68 of the Indiana Administrative Code, the Commission reviews certain financial
transactions to analyze the financial health of the casino licensees and to ensure that a casino owner's license is not leased or hypothecated and that money is not borrowed against or loaned against a casino owner's license.

Both Blue Sky and Caesars submitted their respective requests on September 7, 2018. In addition to seeking permission to act on the proposed financial transaction, both entities also requested a waiver of 68 IAC's two meeting requirement in accordance with the Commission's authority, which is outlined in Resolution 2017-109.

The confidential details of each proposed financial transaction, as well as Commission staff's analysis, has been provided to the Commissioners.

In accordance with the procedures identified in Resolution 2017-109, Blue Sky was granted interim approval to act on its proposed financial transaction on September 28, 2018. Caesars received its interim approval on October 30, 2018.

The interim approvals issued to both entities contain the following conditions, which
are also contained in the draft order you have before you.

First, the terms articulated in the final financing documentation cannot materially differ from the terms that Blue Sky and Caesars have presented to the Commission thus far.

Second, the terms of the final financing documentation must not violate Indiana Code Articles 4-33 or 4-35.

Third, Blue Sky and Caesars must provide the Commission with a legal opinion demonstrating compliance with all applicable laws.

And, finally, Blue Sky and Caesars must close on their proposed financial transactions on or before February 28, 2019.

Resolution 2017-109 requires that the interim approvals be reported to the Commission for consideration and final ratification or other direction.

Commission staff is happy to answer any questions you have at this time. Thank you. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you. Any questions?

What's your pleasure, Commissioners?
COMMISSIONER WILLIAMS: Move to approve

Orders 225 and 226.
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve Orders 225 and 226.

Any further discussion on the motion?
Hearing none, all in favor of the motion, please signify by saying aye.
(Chorus of ayes.)
Opposed.
Motion passes unanimously.
Thank you.
MR. MULLEN: Thank you all.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: And last we have paid fantasy sports matters, renewals, and Dustin again.

MR. MOLOY: Commissioners, you have before you Order \(2018-227\) regarding the renewal of the paid fantasy sports game operator's license for Starstreet, LLC, and Order 2018-228 regarding the renewal of the paid fancy sports operator's license for Yahoo Fantasy Sports, LLC.

Both licensees have filed the proper paperwork and paid the respective renewal fees. Starstreet and Yahoo's licenses were set to expire on November 15, 2018, but Executive

Director Tait issued an interim renewal to each to cover the period between the license's expiration and this business meeting.

Approving Orders 2018-227 and 228 would have the effect of renewing Starstreet and Yahoo's paid fantasy sports game operator's license for a period of one year.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you.
Any questions for Dustin?
Hearing none, what's your pleasure?
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to approve Orders 227 and 228.

COMMISSIONER McCLAIN: Second.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: It's been properly moved and seconded to approve proposed Orders 228 and 227.

All in favor, please signify by saying aye. (Chorus of ayes.)

Opposed.
Thank you. Passes unanimously.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Next,
Commissioners, I thought that given -- given the new casino ownership structures and other
changes, we have six new general managers at the properties, so I'd like to be able to have them
come up and formally introduce themselves to you all and just provide a very brief bio and allow us to welcome them formally. So, I figure if we can go in alphabetical order, that seemed to be the most fair.

So Ron Baumann of Indiana Grand, you're up first.

MR. BAUMANN: I feel blessed. This is what it means when your name starts with \(B\), right.

Good morning. My name is Ron Baumann. I am the general manager at Indiana Grand. I am very blessed to be doing what I love to do. I have been doing this for 30 years and did it right out of -- right out of college, but please don't try to calculate my age because you made me swear that I couldn't lie.

But I knew what I wanted to do right out of school. And \(I\) went into the industry in Atlantic City and worked there for many years. I've been doing this for 30 years.

I've worked for four main companies, I would say, caesars for about 20 years. I worked in Atlantic City for them, I worked in Philadelphia, I worked in Baltimore, a lot on the East Coast.

I also worked for Wynn Resorts for about
five years.
I worked for Rush Gaming out of Chicago for a number of years before \(I\) came back to Caesars.

And I also did a time in what we refer to as Indian gaming, Foxwoods, when it was the number one casino in the U.S.

At my heart I am a food and beverage guy. My undergrad degree is in food and beverage. I love to cook, and I bet I could outcook anybody up there.

I -- I am a Villanova Wildcat, so when everybody talks about Hoosiers and Indiana, when's the last time you won around here, man, you know. We've won two out of the last three, so proud to be -- pardon?

CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: What school is that?
MR. BAUMANN: Villanova.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Wow, wow, wow.
(Laughter)
MR. BAUMANN: Mr. Chairman, you took my joke away. Usually people go, you know, do you play the Hoosiers. I go, yeah, man.

So I love -- love being here in Indiana. The property, the people \(I\) work for are just amazing people. The staff that you have,
particularly Brock and his team at the property, have just been absolutely, absolutely wonderful to work with. Going through the conversion with them was -- they exceeded any expectation and any ask that we could have had, so very, very, very much appreciative of that.

Outside of that, I love to hunt, so there wasn't a lot of hunting left in Jersey to do, so I'm looking forward to hunting here. I love the beach. I have yet to find water around here anywhere, but sooner or later \(I\) will find that.

And with that, if there's anything I can answer for you as I'm up here, please ask.

COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Just come up to Lake Michigan in northwest Indiana. Glad to have you.

MR. BAUMANN: I'll be up there. Three and a half hours, though, right? COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Depends how quick you drive.
(Laughter)
MR. BAUMANN: So one of the things I disclosed on my application was having gotten my driver's license once suspended, so let's just say I had to check off that box.
(Laughter)
Thank you very much.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Thank you.
So next will be Rod Centers, the new -- are you official yet?

MR. CENTERS: Almost.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Tomorrow?
MR. CENTERS: Tomorrow-ish.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: At Hollywood Casinos.

MR. CENTERS: Right. Good afternoon. Executive Staff, Commissioners, good afternoon. I very much appreciate the opportunity to be here today and introduce myself. As Sara mentioned, I will be the general manager at Hollywood Lawrenceburg. I'm very excited for that opportunity, very excited to work in the state, so thank you for that.

I have a lot fewer years than Ron, a lot fewer years in the industry than Ron. I early in my career was in manufacturing, so I did that for a long time, and then I had the opportunity to get in this industry that \(I\) love and truly enjoy working in.

I've worked with several companies including

Caesars Entertainment, Pinnacle Entertainment, JACK Entertainment, and now Penn Gaming, so I'm excited about the opportunity to work here. I look forward to working with each one of you, getting to know you a little better.

Although I probably can't outcook any of you, I bet I can outeat all of you.
(Laughter)
With that said, if there aren't any questions, that will conclude my report.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: So what basketball do you follow?

MR. CENTERS: University of Kentucky without question. And I'm sorry, I apologize.

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you.
MR. CENTERS: Thank you. Have a great day.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: We should do this more often. This is kind of fun.

Next Peter Chu from Belterra Resort.
MR. CHU: So good afternoon, members of the Commission and Executive Staff. My name is Peter Chu. I don't cook, but I eat a lot.
(Laughter)
Anyway, it is an honor to be here and join the Belterra team. I was in the hospitality
industry for about 30 years. The first 20 years is all in resort and hotel and different destinations, and the last ten years, actually I started with Belterra Casino Resort about ten years ago, and subsequently I moved to Vietnam and helped open up the first grand resort in Ho Chi Minh City, and after that went to Louisiana, helping the -- the Asian market and also the casino operation, casino marketing.

Last job was in Black Hawk, Colorado, as the assistant general manager, so now \(I\) join here. So it is very happy to come home. My family spent a lot of years here back ten years ago, and we all love it. So it is very enjoyable to move back, and the staff is excellent and very honored to be here.

Thank you. Any questions?
CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Thank you. Welcome back.
MR. CHU: Thank you.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Next will be Ben
Douglass from Rising Star Casino.
MR. DOUGLASS: I'm ready for college basketball.
(Laughter)
I went to Gonzaga, if anybody looks at the
current standings. Originally from Reno, Nevada. I am a third generation casino person, so I knew what \(I\) wanted to do right out of college as well.

I have much fewer years as well. I graduated in 2006 , spent ten years in our Colorado property. Then we were purchased by Full House, I was in Nevada briefly, back in northern Nevada for about a year and a quarter. And then my boss called me and said you want to move to Indiana, and \(I\) said absolutely, and here I am. I've been here now for about four months. My wife and I absolutely love it. I purchased my house. I live in Lawrenceburg even though I work in Rising Sun. And it's been fantastic. I really enjoy being here, and hope it's for a long time.

CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Great. Welcome. Thank you.

MR. DOUGLASS: Thank you so much.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Trent McIntosh. And I don't know, I think it's -- it's out there, so should I formally say of Harrah's Hoosier Park?

MR. McINTOSH: That's right. Absolutely.
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: All right. That's
the first time I've said it, Harrah's Hoosier Park.

MR. McINTOSH: Thank you. Good afternoon, Chairman, Commissioners and Executive Staff. Thank you for the introduction.

So I've been with Caesars Entertainment, I just finished my ten years with Caesars. Prior to that I spent about ten years with Boyd Gaming, all of my experience in racing and gaming over the years, most recently in Louisiana. I was the assistant general manager of two properties, Harrah's Louisiana Downs and the Horseshoe property there in Bossier City, Louisiana.

Personally, I didn't grow up in Indiana, but the majority of my family is from the Terre Haute area, so grew up an Indiana Hoosier fan. And whenever I found out about the opportunity for a racetrack and casino that Caesars may be purchasing back probably a year ago as this conversation started heating up, I didn't have to wait for anyone to call me. I was raising my hand and reaching out to Mr. Nita and thankfully got the opportunity to come here and glad to be here, so thank you. Any questions?

CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you. Welcome.

MR. McINTOSH: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Sara, I just want to make an observation. So we have Villanova and Gonzaga and University of Kentucky, Indiana. I think they all have national banners hanging, and I'm from Purdue, you know what I'm saying, so we're still working on it. Welcome.

UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You kept Ohio State out of the playoffs, so that's impressive. CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: That was cool. (Laughter)

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Well, last but not least, Brenda Temple from Blue Chip. And hopefully Brenda will say she's an IU fan. CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Are you a Boilermaker, Brenda?

MS. TEMPLE: Actually two years at the University of Oklahoma, graduated at the University of Colorado, so Boomer/Sooner.
(Laughter)
Good afternoon, Commissioner, Executive Staff, Commissioners. My name is Brenda Temple. I'm the general manager at Blue Chip Casino. I've been in the casino industry for 26 years. My background is finance. I received my
bachelor's degree from the University of Colorado and my master's from the University of Memphis when I was working in the Tunica market. I did it through tuition reimbursement from my company. I'm a strong advocate of developing our team, and tuition reimbursement is part of that. I did it as a single mother also, so I support that in all of our team.

This is my second foray here in Indiana. I was here from 2008 to 2013 as the director of finance at Blue Chip. I've been with Boyd Gaming for 14 years. They sent me back to Nevada, which I had never worked in Nevada before. My entire career for the most part has been in the Midwest, except for the last five years, and then they called me to say hey, you want to come back to Indiana and be the GM of Blue Chip, and I said absolutely, so here I am. I've been here since July.

I'm very happy to be part of the community. It's what I told our team at Boyd Gaming I missed about working in the Midwest. You become part of the community. It's not just running a casino, not that that isn't a big job, but being -making a difference in your community is also
very important to me, so I'm happy to be back here in Indiana.

Thank you.
CHAIRMAN MCMAINS: Thank you.
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Well, welcome to northwest Indiana.

MS. TEMPLE: And I have a beach for you.
(Laughter)
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Making friends and influencing people.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Well, welcome to all the new general managers, and we look forward to working with you and appreciate you taking the time to come up and introduce yourselves.

And then, last, we are going to have a presentation from French Lick Casino, so they are going to just give us a property update and then also provide the Commissioners with some information about their impact in the local community.

So presenting today starting us off will be Chris Leininger, the chief operating officer of French Lick.

MR. LEININGER: Good afternoon,
Commissioner McMains and other fellow

Commissioners, Executive Staff. I am going to provide an update on the resort by way of video.

Let me preview that for the purpose of what you're going to see. The first will be a project we started about a year ago in which we took the old tennis center on the grounds of the French Lick Hotel and began to turn it into a full service exhibition hall to serve our group guests and what their needs have been over the past few years.

And then you'll see the starting point of our hotel room expansion that adjoins to the casino building.

And then, last, a project that will get started after we complete the first two, probably into '19 and '20, is an exciting one for us. It's over on the grounds of the West Baden Hotel. The old historic bowling pavilion is going to be converted into a really special wedding and event space.

And so with that, Robert, if you could turn the video on. We'll have Steve Rondinaro, our spokesperson on the video.
(At this time a video was shown and the following is a transcription of the narration in
the video.)
VIDEO NARRATOR: If it seems like construction equipment has become a near permanent part of the landscape around here, it kind of has. And it's pretty exciting. What do you say we go on a little tour.

When the Cook family spent more than \(\$ 560\) million to renovate these two historic hotels and do the other things that created French Lick Resort in 2006 , it was Bill Cook's goal that the place become self-supporting and thrive well into the future. Add rooms and a sports bar to a place that was once in danger of closing down.

The work is going on between the casino and the parking garage. It's a \(\$ 17\) million project slated for completion in fall of 2019. It should look something like this.

We've seen almost 100 percent growth in group room occupancy since the \(\$ 20\) million expansion of the event center in 2015. The adjacent exhibition hall has undergone an extensive renovation in the last year. That project included the installation of a new escalator linking the two buildings, which was no
small task involving one extremely large crane, two fully built, very heavy stairways and one very steady-handed crane operator.

Also underway in the West Baden Gardens is prep work for the renovation of the historic bowling and billiards pavilion. It will become gold gilded wedding and special event space.

All this growth means more opportunity. Yes, there's a lot going on here. Enough to catch the eye of the governor.

GOVERNOR HOLCOMB: And to see all the dynamic growth that's occurring around it, all the conventions, all the traffic that is coming in and seeing how beautiful our state is, it truly is a testament of -- of the local community, the leadership here at the resort and the State of Indiana all working together to -to usher in and cultivate that growth.

VIDEO NARRATOR: We continue to build on our past in creating a bright future.
(End of video.)
MR. LEININGER: I'd be happy to answer any questions you might have on that portion of our presentation, or if there are none, I'll introduce Barry Wininger, who is the president of
the French Lick Town Council.
Barry has been a part of the council in French Lick since the start of the project and has an immense amount of knowledge about what we have been able to do partnering with them, so I'll turn it over to him.

MR. WININGER: Thank you, Mr. Chairman, Commission members. It's an honor to be here and talk today. I'll try to keep it short. I could talk for hours on where French Lick has been for the last 12 years, so, but I'll keep it short.

I got a PowerPoint presentation here, and I'll just quickly go over what's went on in the last 12 years, which is a lot. If you haven't been to French Lick, you need to come down and see us.

We did have -- we were ranked as one of the highest unemployment percentages in the state, which is not a problem now. You can drive anywhere through French Lick, almost every business has a "Help Wanted" sign on the door, so, I mean, it's not a problem now. If you want to work and you live in Orange County, you can work. May not be the exact job you want, but you can work. The factories that shut down, we lost more than a thousand jobs. Kimball International basically pulled out of French Lick and West Baden and left two vacant buildings sitting there. Our airport was virtually nonexistent traffic. It was just basically locals that had planes that, you know, you might hear a plane or two on a Sunday or Saturday. Our business development was at a complete standstill. Nobody really wanted to invest in French Lick. Everybody thought the hotel was going to fail, which it probably would have if it hadn't been for the casino. And, you know, unattractive businesses, no maintenance and that kind of stuff had been taking place for years, so.

But after the casino come in, it seemed like we went from zero to a hundred in about five minutes. We were able to do critical
infrastructure upgrades. We was able to buy new emergency vehicles. We bought a hundred foot aerial truck that would actually reach the top of the resort hotel that the fire department had never had in all those years. If you'd ever had a fire over there, it would have just been over with. We would have lost the whole place
probably.
There's been a Little League facility put in Paoli, which is about five or six miles, seven miles from French Lick, on the edge of Paoli. They're really nice facilities, got four Little League fields, got a football field, a walking track, a soccer field. It's a very, very nicely done facility, which is a direct result of the casino revenue that Paoli took in from up there. Another thing is our grant problems. It's been a lot easier for us to get grants because we're able to get the matching money to go with it. Before, you know, you could get a million dollar grant, but you couldn't come up with the \(\$ 250,000\) to match it to get the grant, so it was -- you know, it was just a never-ending battle of not being able to get anywhere.

I can't see the bottom one there, what I have on there.

Yeah, basically our communities -- probably over the last 12 years, our communities, there's probably been well over a hundred million dollars spent in all the communities. And, you know, French Lick and West Baden, of course, have been a lot of that, but also Paoli and Orleans.

My notes are on here, step up here where I can see my notes.

Yeah, the Orange County courthouse project, West Baden Town Hall, we built a new airport terminal, the community park, as I mentioned, in Paoli were all part of those projects that were directly attributed to casino revenue.

Infrastructure improvements made possible, like I said, I mentioned the fire truck and emergency equipment.

Town green project, which -- or what we call the town green is a big, kind of cattywampus building that's downtown and all the green area down there, that's all part of that project.

Stormwater utilities. We've been trying to do at least one project a year of a million or more in our streets, sidewalks, stormwater. And when we go through and do it, we do it all. We do retaining walls, everything. I mean we completely strip the street and start all over. And I'm saying at this point we've got -- we've got more projects on slate for the next five years. Once we get through the five years, we'll have got everything cycled and then probably have to start all over again, but it's something that
would have never happened. Our sidewalks were all falling apart, and it was just a bad sight.

The Patoka Lake water project, we were able to hook directly to Patoka. The water plant the two towns had was well over a hundred years old and was going to require major, major renovations to bring it up to code, current codes, so that was, you know, connected to Patoka which has the capability to get us the gallonage we need, and that's another thing that's been -- that was a -basically all that project that was funded out of casino money there.

Our sewer plant renovation, we had to expand the capacity of our -- we didn't even have the capacity when the casino first decided they were going to open one up down there, we didn't even have the capacity, so we had to do a \(\$ 10\) million renovation of that, so we've got capacity now for probably the next 15, 20 years.

The Spring Valley Schools, and this is just information that was provided by the superintendent, you know, they've done several things over there as a direct result of the LDA and the casino money, retaining walls, track repairs. They just got through putting brand-new
flooring in all the elementary school. They've put a new HVAC system in the pool area, new playground equipment, laptop -- they got laptops or Chrome Books that they give to all the students, from grade 1 through 12 all have Chrome Books now. Educational software, textbooks, PE equipment. They've updated their security for the -- they went through -- all the doors in the classrooms have all been replaced with doors you can't kick in. You know, the -- once they're locked, they're locked, you can't -- you can't get in them. And it's all -- they're all connected electronically and stuff. So that -they've well spent the money over there on security, which everybody's concerned with in this day and age.

Our airport has increased by, I think it says 700 percent. I'm relying on my airport manager to give me this. We've hosted aircraft from over 50 countries -- or 50 states and some from outside of the country. There's been 20,000 landings and takeoffs in the last -- since 2006, new parallel runway, new terminal building. They've repainted the runways. They've just finished that project. They grooved the runways.

If you've not seen that facility, it's a very nice facility compared to what was there. It was -- I mean it was basically a road with a few numbers on it and little bitty planes, but it's impressive the size of some of the planes we've had in out there.

And it was really a key part when the resort done the Senior LPGA. The amount of jets that those guys flew in on was kind of mind-boggling, so, something we don't see very often.

The town green, I had talked about that earlier. That's a project that was in downtown, it's \$7 million, which also included additional housing, three new restaurants, it's got a quick care medical facility built into it, event space out front, and so that's part of that project downtown. And it's fully -- fully rented out now. All the apartments are rented out. There's three high ends and then 60 one- and two-bedroom units. And all the retail space is also rented in that facility.

One thing I didn't mention was our TIF district, which we -- when the casino come in we set up a TIF district which included the space where the casino is, so we are collecting
revenues off the \(T I F\) too. That's been part of our sidewalk and stormwater renewal every year. We bought a lot of unattractive properties and tore them down and cleaned them up. A lot of landscaping. We've actually used some of the stuff to provide equipment for the street department. One thing about it, when you put a lot of landscaping in, there's a lot of work that goes with it. You know, you don't think about it until about a year down the road, you're trimming all that stuff up.

Anyway, that's kind of a quick overview. I'd be more than happy to answer any questions, and love to invite you all down to come see us. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Thank you. COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Thank you.

MR. WININGER: Thank you.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: Any questions, folks?

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Well, thank you very much for being here today. Those are three very exciting projects going on at the casino, and we applaud your investment and also love hearing about the local development money going to good work and all of the things that the town council is doing down there, so thank you very
much for being here as well.
CHAIRMAN McMAINS: I have a couple quick comments. Thank you to all of our Commission staff. You folks do a fantastic job. We work closely with Sara and Jenny and Greg, and they have to be the best in the country. They do a fantastic job of regulating our gaming business, and thank you very much for all your hard work. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TAIT: Thank you. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: I also want to thank my fellow Commissioners. You may not know, but these are citizen servants and they take time out of their jobs and their days to come here for these meetings and study the materials, and appreciate -- appreciate you serving our state. And wish all of you, all of you, a wonderful holiday season.

The next meeting will be announced at a later time when we get that fully set. And is there any other business to come before the Commission today?

Hearing none.
COMMISSIONER SVETANOFF: Motion to adjourn. CHAIRMAN McMAINS: There's been a motion to adjourn. Is there a second?
