

ORDER 2006-8

**AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION
CONCERNING THE RENEWAL OF
VENDINGDATA CORPORATION'S SUPPLIER'S LICENSE**

In accordance with and subject to Indiana Code 4-33 and 68 IAC 2-22 of the Indiana Administrative Code, the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") previously issued a permanent supplier's license to VendingData Corporation ("VendingData").


A supplier's license is valid for a period of one (1) year and in accordance with IC 4-33-7-8 and 68 IAC 2-2-8, a supplier's license must be renewed annually along with the payment of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the annual renewal fee. Pursuant to Resolution 2005-49, the Commission extended VendingData's supplier's license on September 26, 2005 for a period of six (6) months while the Commission investigated the allegations that were brought against VendingData by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board for failure of a former senior executive director to disclose information on his application. A hearing was held January 24, 2006 and the matter was considered by the Louisiana Gaming Control Board ("LGCB") at its meeting of February 21, 2006.

On March 1, 2006, VendingData informed Commission staff that it had reached a settlement agreement with the LGCB which was ratified at the above referenced February 21st meeting. Until Commission staff has an opportunity to fully analyze the facts and circumstances surrounding the Louisiana settlement the Commission is unable to make a final determination whether the actions taken by Louisiana Gaming Control Board should detrimentally affect VendingData's Indiana supplier's license.

VendingData's six (6) month extension expires on April 23, 2006. In order to enable Commission staff sufficient time to complete its investigation into the matters surrounding VendingData's Louisiana settlement, the Commission hereby **GRANTS** extension of VendingData's supplier's license for a period of approximately **THREE (3) MONTHS** until the Commission reconvenes at the second quarter business meeting to consider this matter further.

**ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION
CONCERNING THE RENEWAL OF SUPPLIER'S LICENSES**

In accordance with and subject to Indiana Code 4-33 and 68 IAC 2-2 of the Indiana Administrative Code, the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") has previously issued permanent supplier's licenses to (1) WMS Gaming, Inc., (2) Bally Gaming, Inc., (3) Dallman Systems, Inc., (4) Atlantic City Coin and Slot Service, Inc. and (5) Certegy Transaction Services, Inc.

A supplier's license is valid for a period of one (1) year and in accordance with IC 4-33-7-8 and 68 IAC 2-2-8, a supplier's license must be renewed annually along with the payment of Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000) for the annual renewal fee. Pursuant to Resolutions 2005-9 and 2005-10, the Commission renewed the licenses of the supplier licensees referenced above.

Each of these licensees has requested renewal of licensure and the renewal fees have been paid in accordance with 68 IAC 2-2-3(c) and 68 IAC 2-2-8. The Commission has determined that the above-named supplier licensees remain in substantial compliance with IC 4-33 and are suitable to hold a supplier's license.

The Commission hereby **GRANTS** renewal of the licenses of each of the suppliers for a period of one year as specified below:

- (1) WMS Gaming, Inc.: valid March 17, 2006 through March 16, 2007
- (2) Bally Gaming, Inc.: valid March 30, 2006 through March 29, 2007
- (3) Dallman Systems, Inc.: valid March 30, 2006 through March 29, 2007
- (4) Atlantic City Coin & Slot Service Co., Inc.: valid February 26, 2006 through February 25, 2007
- (5) Certegy Transaction Services, Inc.: valid February 26, 2006 through February 25, 2007

Each licensee shall be responsible for notifying the Commission of its desire to be considered for a subsequent license renewal at least thirty (30) days before the expiration of the license.
