

ORDER 2008-122

**AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION
CONCERNING THE VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION PROGRAM
CASE NO. VEP-08-56**

On or about June 10, 2008, John Doe #56 submitted an application to the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") to participate in the Voluntary Exclusion Program for a lifetime exclusion. Pursuant to 68 IAC 6-3-2(g), a participant in the program agrees that if he or she violates the terms of the program and enters the gaming area of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission, he or she will forfeit any jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager made at the facility. Forfeited winnings are to be withheld by the casino licensee and remitted to the Commission, which shall collect such funds as a fine levied against the individual for violating the terms of the program.

On or about August 27, 2008, John Doe #56 was discovered to be present at Hoosier Park. At that time, John Doe #56 had \$10.62 in his possession. Hoosier Park withheld the winnings as required by Commission regulations. Commission staff now seeks Commission approval for remittance, less applicable taxes on the winnings, as a fine against John Doe #56.

COMMISSION ACTION

The Commission, after having reviewed this matter:


APPROVES

the remittance of the jackpot in the amount of \$10.62, less applicable taxes, as a fine levied against John Doe #56.

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-5, this ORDER becomes effective 15 days following receipt of the Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission.
