

**ORDER 2010-15**  
**AN ORDER OF THE INDIANA GAMING COMMISSION**  
**CONCERNING THE VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION PROGRAM**  
**CASE NO. VEP-10-14**

On or about July 1, 2009, John Doe #14 submitted an application to the Indiana Gaming Commission ("Commission") to participate in the Voluntary Exclusion Program for lifetime exclusion. Pursuant to 68 IAC 6-3-2(g), a participant in the program agrees that if he or she violates the terms of the program and enters the gaming area of a facility under the jurisdiction of the Commission he or she willingly forfeits any money or thing of value obtained from or owed to the participant by a casino. The casino must withhold forfeited monies or things of value and remit them to the Commission, which collects the funds.

On or about November 3, 2009, John Doe #14 was discovered to be present at Hollywood Casino ("Hollywood"). At that time, John Doe #14 had obtained \$1,160.00 in chips from Hollywood. Hollywood withheld the monies as required by Commission regulations and seeks Commission approval for remittance, less applicable taxes on the winnings, in fulfillment of John Doe #14's voluntary exclusion application.

The Commission, after reviewing this matter:

APPROVES

the remittance of \$1,160.00, less applicable taxes, in fulfillment of John Doe #14's voluntary exclusion application.

Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-5, this ORDER becomes effective 15 days following receipt of the Order of the Indiana Gaming Commission.
