

ORDER 2011-166

**AN ORDER DENYING THE APPEAL OF VOLUNTARY EXCLUSION
REMITTANCE OF JOHN DOE #17 (VEP 11-17).**

On March 17, 2011, in Order 2011-17, the Indiana Gaming Commission (“Commission”) approved remittance of \$5,416.00 against John Doe #17 for the reason that John Doe #17 was a participant in the Voluntary Exclusion Program at the time John Doe #17 won a \$5,416.00 jackpot while in the gaming area of the Hollywood Casino in Lawrenceburg, Indiana.

On April 5, 2011, John Doe #17 filed with the Commission a request for hearing to review Order 2011-17. On or about May 27, 2011, Commission staff filed a Motion for Summary Judgment with Administrative Law Judge Michael Cook for the reason that there were no factual issues in dispute and that the Administrative Law Judge could make a ruling based solely on those undisputed facts and applicable law. On July 1, 2011, Judge Cook held a hearing on staff’s motion, to which John Doe #17 failed to attend. On July 8, 2011, Judge Cook issued his confidential Order in this matter, which included a recommendation that the Commission summarily deny John Doe #17’s petition for review of Order 2011-17.

COMMISSION ACTION


After reviewing the foregoing and in accordance with IC 4-21.5-3-29, the Commission hereby:

the Administrative Law Judge’s Order. Pursuant to IC 4-21.5-3-6, this Order will become effective fifteen (15) days after it is served.


