The scope of the 3-Day IWAB course is that of effective intelligence analysis writing and briefing skills that are needed as a foundation for intelligence analysts. The core topics covered in the course are creative/critical thinking and critical reading skills, source evaluation, privacy and civil rights, intelligence product writing structure and style, and creating and presenting intelligence briefings.

There is no tuition fee for this NW3C class for anyone actively employed with a State, Local or Tribal Law Enforcement agency.

Intelligence Writing and Briefing, a DHS/FEMA grant-funded project, addresses the demonstrated need for fusion centers and other analysts to produce high quality intelligence reports and briefings. This 3-day course is for state, local, and tribal law enforcement and regulatory agency personnel. The training includes basic intelligence writing and briefing principles and methods to facilitate increased intelligence sharing.

Upon completion of this training, students will be able to: Use creative and critical thinking skills; Utilize critical reading skills; Identify the different types of available intelligence information sources and recognize the strengths and weaknesses associated with each; Rate the validity and reliability of different types of sources; Convey analytic confidence; Produce a structurally sound, actionable analytical report; Explain the importance of the product review process; Identify common report types and appropriate uses; Construct and deliver an intelligence briefing;
