
ADA ASSURANCES

INDOT assures that no individual with a qualifying disability shall, solely on the basis of his or her disability, be excluded from the participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any of its programs, services, or activities as provided by Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) of 1990 (42 U.S.C. §§ 12101 et seq.) and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (29 U.S.C. § 794) and implementing regulations found in 28 CFR 35.106 and 49 CFR Part 27.

INDOT will use its best efforts, upon request, to provide appropriate aids and services leading to effective communication for qualified persons with disabilities so they can participate equally in its programs, services, and activities. These accommodations may include providing qualified sign language interpreters, documents in Braille, and other products or services to make information and communications accessible to people who have speech, hearing, or vision impairments.

INDOT will make reasonable modifications to policies and programs, upon request, to ensure that people with disabilities have an equal opportunity to enjoy all of its programs, services and activities.

INDOT will investigate all documented complaints and take such remedial action deemed necessary to overcome the effects of a confirmed violation.
