FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT
For 106th Street and I-69 Interchange, Hamilton County


This project provides a new interchange on I-69 at 106th Street. The limits of the proposed work along I-69 extend from approximately 2400 feet south to approximately 2,800 feet north of the 106th Street overpass. The limits of the proposed work along 106th Street extend from approximately 950 feet west to approximately 1,350 feet east of the centerline of I-69. The project will significantly reduce congestion at the two adjoining interchanges and not significantly increase traffic beyond the immediate vicinity of the new interchange.

An environmental assessment was approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) on August 19, 2015, and a Public Hearing was held on September 10, 2015. FHWA has reviewed the additional information provided with the FONSI request and has determined that they satisfactorily respond to the public hearing comments. Overall the project does not result in any significant impacts to either the human or natural environment.

This Finding of No Significant Impact (FONSI) is based on the attached Environmental Assessment and the additional information included in the November 18, 2015 INDOT FONSI request. These documents provide sufficient evidence and analysis for determining that an environmental impact statement is not required for this project. The FHWA takes full responsibility for the accuracy, scope and content of these documents.
