DNA: From “The Bleeding” to the “Grim Sleeper,” focusing on the development of DNA and on how it is being optimally used in California, particularly Los Angeles County. Review of several serial murder cases as well as the apprehension of the so called “Grim Sleeper,” a prolific serial murderer who murdered perhaps as many as two dozen women over 25 years and who was identified through a “partial match/familial search” techniques. This case marks the first time this technique was utilized in United States history to solve a murder case.
