12. Transportation Emergency

- Planning for transportation safety includes planning ahead for possible situations that may occur such as mechanical breakdowns or accidents on the road when hauling a trailer loaded with livestock.
- A transportation emergency plan refers to the Emergency Information Truck and Trailer form, which should be placed in a zip lock bag in the glove compartment of any truck that may be used to transport livestock. Keeping it in your binder will not help you during an emergency on the road.
