MEET THE SPEAKERS

Judith A Monroe, M.D., FAAFP

From 1992 until her appointment as state health commissioner Dr. Monroe served as the director of the St. Vincent Primary Care Center and Family Medicine Residency Program in Indianapolis. Prior to her time at St. Vincent she was Clinical Director with the Department of Family Medicine at Indiana University School of Medicine. Dr. Monroe was a National Health Service Corps Scholar and fulfilled her commitment practicing in Appalachia following her residency training in family medicine at the University of Cincinnati.

Dr. Monroe is a family doctor and has always been passionate about eliminating health disparities. She has received numerous awards for her teaching, clinical, and leadership skills.

Charlene Graves, M.D., FAAP

Dr. Graves is the Medical Director for the Immunization, Childhood Communicable Disease, Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention, Injury Prevention, and School Health Programs at the Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH). She is also a medical consultant to the Children with Special Health Care Services Program at ISDH. She is Co-Chairman of the ISDH Pandemic Influenza Planning Committee. She began her work at ISDH in September 2000, after serving as Director of Pediatric Residents Training at Methodist Hospital in Indianapolis for 17 years. She received her undergraduate degree from Michigan State University, attended Medical School at the University of Wisconsin, and completed her pediatric residency training at Montefiore Hospital in New York City before moving to Indianapolis in 1978. She served as President of the Indiana Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) from 1990-1996. She serves on a variety of committees or groups related to immunization, pandemic influenza planning, injury prevention, trauma system development and lead poisoning.

Alan Hinman, M.D., M.P.H.

Since 1965 Dr. Hinman has been involved in public health programs at state, national, and international levels, primarily working with CDC, serving as Director of the Immunization Division, Director of the National Center for Prevention Services, and eventually, Senior Advisor to the Director. He retired from the U.S. Public Health Service in July 1996, having attained the rank of Assistant Surgeon General. Dr. Hinman has authored or co-authored more than 300 scientific publications. He is an Adjunct Professor at the Rollins School of Public Health of Emory University and is also Speaker of the Governing Council of the American Public Health Association.

Karee Buffin

Karee Buffin received her Bachelor of Science Degree in 1989 from Ball State University (BSU) in Wellness and Exercise Physiology. She developed a Wellness and cardiac rehabilitation program for a physician's office in Portland, Indiana and later worked as a Health Educator for Ball State University, a Laboratory Supervisor for the Exercise Science Department, and also designed the university's wellness center. In 1996, Karee first joined ISDH as an immunization technician on a mobile team. She returned to BSU and completed her Masters Degree in 1999. In 2000, she returned to the ISDH Immunization Program as a public health investigator and now serves as the Vaccine Preventable Disease Epidemiologist at ISDH.

Penny Lewis

Penny Lewis joined the ISDH Immunization Program in January of 2007 as the CHIRP Project Manager. Prior to coming to ISDH she spent five years working independently developing custom databases and e-learning environments. She was the CEO/President of the Indiana Brain Injury Association and Project Manager of the National Bone Marrow Donor Program in Indiana. She earned her Bachelors of Arts degree from Kentucky Wesleyan College.

Julie Moise

Julie Moise is a Board member and Third-Party Committee member of Families Fighting Flu (FFF), a non-profit, volunteer-based corporation established in 2004 that is made up of families and healthcare practitioners who have experienced firsthand the death of a child due to influenza. In December 2003 Julie and her husband lost their 6½-month-old son, Ian, to influenza. Julie has now dedicated herself to educating others about the seriousness of influenza and the importance of annual vaccination, particularly in children. As an avid speaker, Julie has spoken at several conferences about her son's story, most recently at the Immunize Georgia Conference in 2006 and at Louisiana State University in September 2007. In memory of their son, Julie and her husband created Ian's Rainbow Flu Foundation, which is dedicated to providing information about influenza and vaccination. Julie is a mother of four who volunteers at her children's school and is very active in the Parent Teacher Association.

Kelly Zachrich

Ms. Zachrich serves as Director of the Indiana Immunization Coalition. The Coalition has given a voice to multiple groups concerned about the welfare of children and public health. One of the first actions of the coalition was to secure an immunization registry in Indiana to assist in increasing immunization rates. The Coalition continues to work at the policy level, most recently assisting in securing \$10 million in state monies for children's vaccine. The Coalition exists to provide statewide leadership that creates opportunities for participation, education and collaboration on immunization issues. She also serves as Director of Super Shot, Inc., a not-for-profit childhood immunization program. Super Shot operates over 30 immunization clinics each month throughout Allen County and collaborates with community-based organizations to increase the immunization rate for children at risk.

**INDIANA IMMUNIZATION CONFERENCE 2007
AWARD CRITERIA**

GENERAL CRITERIA

The awards are based on immunization coverage levels of children age 24 to 35 months, as assessed during participation in the Assessment, Feedback, Incentives, and eXchange of information (AFIX/CoCasa) process and Site Visit Questionnaire. Assessments including both CoCasas and Site Visit Questionnaires conducted between September 1, 2006 and September 15, 2007 have been considered for recognition. Additionally, the provider must maintain documentation for ACIP recommended immunizations for at least 25 children in the 24 to 35 month range.

2007 RATE CRITERIA

To be eligible for an award, a practice must excel in two categories:

Assessment Measure	Maximum Amount of Points Awarded
1. CoCasa* - Immunization series assessed will be the 4DTaP; 3 Polio; 1 MMR; 3Hib; 3 Hep B for 2 year olds including children brought late up-to-date by the assessment date.	50
2. Site Visit Questionnaire	50
Maximum Number of Points Awarded	100

*Sites must have at least 25 charts assessed to be eligible for an award

To receive an award, a site must have a cumulative score of at least 90 points.

AWARDS

Plaques have been awarded to immunization providers with a score of 95 points or higher.

Certificates have been awarded to immunization providers with a score of 90.0 to 94.9 points.

AWARDS for MOST IMPROVED

An additional category of award has been given to the immunization provider who has shown the most improvement in their immunization rates for the 4:3:1:3:3 series completed by 24 months (late up-to-date not included) since the 2006 award assessment period. Sites eligible for consideration received assessments including CoCasas and Site Visit Questionnaires during both the 2006 and 2007 award assessment periods and had at least 25 charts assessed during each period. Awards have been given to both the Public and Private sector of immunization providers.

Health Education / VFC Enrollment Staff

Three Health Educators provide education on immunization administration, vaccine preventable diseases, reporting requirements, and immunization programs across three regions statewide. They enroll vaccine providers in the Vaccine for Children (VFC) program. The educators offer "specialized" trainings for school nurses, health care personnel, WIC and Head Start staff, and for Medical Assistant programs. The A to Z training includes sections on: CHIRP, basics of immunity and vaccination, vaccine preventable disease (VPD) and vaccines (children and adults), vaccine storage and handling, precautions and contraindications, vaccine administration, general recommendations as well as school requirements, myths and misconceptions, reading records, and where access reliable information. Refer to Map #2 for contact information.

Perinatal Hepatitis B Investigation Staff

Perinatal Hepatitis B (PHB) staff investigates all hepatitis B surface antigen lab reports for women aged 12-50 years of age to determine pregnancy status and risk for HBV infection. Three PHB investigators cover the state by region and provide case management on the assigned cases including follow-up on households to be sure all members are immunized and are aware of their risk for Hepatitis B infection. They serve as liaisons to hospitals, physicians, local health departments as well as the general public. PHB staff also provides educational training as needed. Refer to Map #3 for contact information.

Immunization/ Public Health Investigators /AFIX Staff

Ten immunization outreach field staff provide technical assistance to local health departments and other immunization providers across the state by region. They are the primary investigators of suspected vaccine preventable diseases. As AFIX staff, they assess VFC provider offices, provide feedback on ways to improve performance, encourage improved performance, and share best practice concepts among providers. As outreach staff, they gather information from and share information with providers throughout their assigned regions. Refer to Map #4 for contact information.





 Health Education/VFC Enrollement Regions**




