

In 2004, Governor Joe Kernan and the Indiana General Assembly approved the creation of the Indiana Stroke Prevention Task Force. It is charged with the following responsibilities:

- complete a statewide comprehensive stroke needs assessment.
- develop and implement a comprehensive public education program targeted to high risk populations.
- recommend and disseminate guidelines on the treatment of stroke patients, including emergency stroke care.
- ensure that the public and health care providers are informed regarding the most effective strategies for stroke prevention.
- advise the state department of health concerning grant opportunities for providers of emergency medical services and for hospitals to improve care to stroke patients.
