## Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses

### Faculty Course Description

Advanced Trauma Care for Nurses (ATCN®) is an advanced course designed for registered nurses interested in expanding their knowledge and skills in the management of multiple trauma patients. The ATCN Faculty Course is designed to prepare faculty candidates to assume various roles as an instructor in an ATCN program. It includes an introductory didactic presentation followed by practical skill sessions to develop teaching/testing and counseling skills. The various sessions provide the opportunity to teach, practice and be evaluated in the various roles. The ideal faculty candidate is a registered nurse who successfully completed an ATCN Student Course within the last 4 years and achieved an Instructor Potential rating. The candidate should demonstrate a interest in and enthusiasm for teaching in the ATCN Program.

### Continuing Education Credit
