## Description & Objectives

## Course Purpose

- To prepare the bedside practitioner in early identification of deteriorating patient
- To better prepare the non-intensivist for the first 24 hours of management of the critically ill patient until transfer or appropriate critical care consultation can be arranged
- To assist the non-intensivist in dealing with sudden deterioration of critically ill patient
- To prepare house staff for ICU coverage
- To prepare nurses and other critical care practitioners to deal with acute deterioration in the seriously and critically ill patient

## Course Objectives

At the end of this program, the participants should be able to:

- Prioritize assessment needs for the critically ill patient
- Select appropriate diagnostic testing.
- Identify and respond to significant changes in the unstable patient.
- Determine the need for expert consultation and/or patient transfer.
- Optimally accomplish transfer to higher level of care
