MEDICAL DIRECTOR AGREEMENT

THIS MEDICAL DIRECTOR AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into by and between UNION HOSPITAL, INC., an Indiana nonprofit corporation ("Union") and MARK O. LYNCH, M.D. ("Physician").

WITNESSETH THAT:

WHEREAS, Union owns and operates a general acute-care hospital and health care facilities which provide medical services for patients in west central Indiana and east central Illinois; and

WHEREAS, Union recognizes it to be in the best interest of patient care that a qualified physician trained as a surgeon be retained to perform the duties and administrative functions in Trauma Surgery and Medical Services and serve as Co-Medical Director of Union Hospital Terre Haute's Intensive Care Unit; and

WHEREAS, Physician holds an unlimited license to practice medicine in the State of Indiana and has the training, professional talents and skills required to provide the Co-Medical Director Services called for under this Agreement; and

NOW, THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual covenants and acts to be kept and performed by the parties hereto, the parties contract and agree as follows:

1.1. **Representations, Warranties and Conditions Precedent to Agreement.** Physician represents and warrants that he has and will, during the term of this Agreement, satisfy the following requirements:

- 1.1-1. Physician has and maintains in good standing an unlimited license to practice medicine in the State of Indiana, together with all applicable and current and unrestricted narcotic numbers (Federal [D.E.A.] and State Narcotic Registration). Further, Physician shall comply with the regulations and standards of professional conduct adopted by the Medical Licensing Board or Regulatory Agencies dealing with the practice of medicine in the State of Indiana.
- 1.1-2. Physician is granted and maintains Active Staff privileges at Union Hospital in accordance with the Medical and Dental Staff By-Laws of Union Hospital, Inc. and thereafter shall be a duly admitted member of Union Hospital, Inc.'s Medical and Dental Staff.
- 1.1-3. Employee is granted and maintains clinical privileges at Union Hospital in accordance with the Medical and Dental Staff By-Laws of a sufficient level that he has and maintains the right to admit patients to Union Hospital and to provide all the services called for under this Agreement.
- 1.1-4. Physician must be a qualified health care provider within the meaning of the Indiana Medical Malpractice Act, I.C. §34-18-1-1 et seq. as currently in force and effect or as subsequently amended and Physician must carry in full force and effect professional liability insurance with limits at least equal to the minimum limits provided for under the Indiana Medical Malpractice Act as currently in force and or as subsequently amended.
- 1.1-5. Physician is and remains Board Certified in General Surgery by the American Board of Surgery or equivalent during all times that this Agreement remains in force and effect.
- 1.1-6. Physician complies with all requirements and standards promulgated by applicable organizations and governmental bodies with authority over Union as it pertains to the services rendered under this Agreement.

- 1.1-7. Physician complies with the rules and regulations, policies and procedures of Union as they may from time to time exist and act at all times in a professional manner consistent with Union's standards.
- 1.1-8. Physician provides professional services to all patients, within the scope of the practice, who present at the Medical Facility without unlawful discrimination based on such patients' ability to pay, race, creed, color, national origin, age, sex or disability.
- 1.1-9. Physician is not and may not be subject to any disciplinary action or investigation initiated by any state or federal authority that would impact his qualifications as a Medicare or Medicaid provider. Physician must never have been prohibited from providing services for Medicare or Medicaid recipients.
- 1.1-10. Physician shall successfully take and complete Advanced Trauma Life Support training (ATLS).
- 1.1-11. Physician must not be disqualified to provide services under this Agreement for any of the following disqualifying reasons:
 - (a) Physician is or was ever a Sanctioned Practitioner. The term "Sanctioned Practitioner" means an individual or entity who has been excluded by the United States Department of Health and Human Services Office of Inspector General (OIG) from participation in Federal health care programs pursuant to Section 1128 of the Social Security Act; or an individual or entity that has been suspended, debarred, declared ineligible or otherwise excluded by any agency of the United States Government or by the General Accounting Office from any federal procurement or non-procurement program; or
 - (b) An Officer of Union has provided written notice to Physician stating that a reasonable determination has been made that such Physician's continued performance in Union's facilities will present a substantial threat to the safety or care of Union's patients, which remains uncured within a reasonable time in light of the circumstances; or
 - (c) Physician has made materially false or misleading representations regarding his qualifications to render professional services under this Agreement; or
 - (d) Physician has been convicted of a felony or any other crime involving moral turpitude, has been adjudicated incompetent; or
 - (e) Physician is unable, with reasonable accommodation, to perform the essential functions of his position due to any physical or mental illness, injury or impairment.

1.2. **Notification.** Physician agrees to immediately notify Union if any of the above representations and warranties ceases to be true and correct. Physician contracts and agrees that should he fail to meet the requirements set forth under Section 1.1, Union will remove Physician from the provision of services pursuant to this Agreement.

2.1. **Term.** This Agreement shall take effect on the 1st day of June, 2015, and shall continue in force and effect for a period of twelve (12) months, terminating at 11:59 p.m., prevailing Terre Haute time, on the 31st day of May, 2016, unless otherwise terminated as provided for in this Agreement.

At the end of the Initial Term and any Renewal Term, this Agreement shall thereafter renew automatically for successive twelve (12) month terms ("Renewal Term"), under the same provisions as then in force and effect, unless at least sixty (60) days prior to the expiration of the then existing Initial Term or Renewal Term either party gives to the other party written notice of its intention not to renew this Agreement.

3.1. **Medical Director Duties.** The duties to be performed by Physician pursuant to this Agreement shall consist of the following:

3.1-1. **Trauma Medical Director Services.**

- (a) Chair Trauma Peer Review Committee.
- (b) Chair Trauma Operations Committee.
- (c) Be a member of Union's Disaster Committee.
- (d) Assist Union in development, coordination and provide input on the development and maintenance of practice guidelines, policies and methodologies for trauma medical/surgical patient care.
- (e) Demonstrate consistent, efficient, cost effective, quality trauma medical/surgical care at all times.
- (f) Meet established Health Information and hospital standards for documentation and turnaround times.
- (g) Report quality of care issues promptly to appropriate individuals, including Trauma Program Manager, Risk Manager, Chief of Staff and Administration.
- (h) Coordinate and participate in all relevant trauma medical QA/PI/UR and peer review activities as required by the Medical Staff, Trauma Service and Union.
- (i) Assist Union in coordinating the transition of the patient to sub-acute care.
- (j) Collaborate with the Trauma Program Manager to establish trauma program goals and objectives consistent with those of the hospital and ensure that those of the trauma service are being met.
- (k) Consistently demonstrate positive interpersonal relationships with colleagues, hospital personnel, and patients/family in order to achieve maximum operational effectiveness and customer satisfaction.
- (l) Perform and participate in an annual review (credentialing) process of all Trauma Surgeons and Co-Specialists providing trauma care at Union Hospital, Inc.
- (m) In conjunction with the representatives from the co-specialties will recommend and approve qualified medical/surgical trauma team privileges.

- (n) Coordinate, participate and chair trauma, educational, quality assurance and multi-disciplinary meetings.
- (o) Assist Union in ensuring compliance of the trauma medical/surgical care with all regulatory and trauma designation/verification requirements including ACS, HFAP, OSHA, EMTALA (COBRA) and local designating agencies.
- (p) Assist Union in development of strategic relationships with referring hospitals and physicians.
- (r) Participate in trauma patient/family satisfaction projects.
- (s) Assist the Trauma Program Manager in developing and meeting the Trauma Service budgetary goals.
- (t) Participate in the education/training of hospital personnel, trauma surgeons and co-specialists.
- (u) Participate in the education of residents, medical students and professional students as requested and approved by Union Hospital, Inc. and allowed by professional practice commitment.
- (v) During all periods of time of providing Medical Director Services be current ATLS.
- (w) Must attend rural trauma team development course.
- (x) Provide such other administrative services and medical director services as are reasonably required for Union to obtain and maintain Level III Trauma designation.

All time spent by Physician in his performance of the above-delineated duties is compensable hereunder. In each instance where Physician's participation in a meeting or meetings in the course of such duties consumes less than sixty (60) continuous minutes, Physician is entitled to bill and be paid for a minimum of one (1) hour. Time over one (1) hour, but less than a full one (1) hour, would thereafter be prorated. (Example #1: Physician attends a meeting that would last 30 minutes. Physician would be paid for 1 hour or Example #2: Physician attends a meeting which lasts 90 minutes. Physician would be paid for 1 ½ hours or Provided, further however, isolated phone calls to or from Physician in the course of his performance of these duties shall be billed and paid in quarter (.25) hour (rounded up) increments.

3.1-2. Intensive Care Unit (ICU) Co-Medical Director Services.

- (a) Serve as Co-Medical Director of the Intensive Care Unit ("ICU") providing input on policy and administration needs of trauma ICU patients.
- (b) Provide medical oversight of trauma patient services in the ICU.
- (c) Work collaboratively together with the Vice President of Medical Affairs & Chief Medical Director, the Vice President of Patient Care & Chief Nursing Officer, and the manager of the ICU to supervise services rendered to trauma patients in such unit.

- (d) Review quality of care/practice issues related to trauma patients in the ICU.
- (e) Work in conjunction with Vice President of Medical Affairs & Chief Medical Director, the Vice President of Patient Care & Chief Nursing Officer, and the manager of the ICU in developing and implementing strategic plans and goals for the ICU related to trauma services.
- (f) Cooperate with Union in all authorized inspections (for example, Indiana State Department of Health and HFAP) pertaining to the operation of the services and its quality assurance, performance improvement, and utilization management procedures.
- (g) Such other administrative duties as required to assist Union in seeing that the services comply with all federal, state, and local rules and regulations and rules and regulations of the Indiana State Department of Health and standards of the Healthcare Facilities Accreditation Program (HFAP).
- (h) Perform such other administrative duties as may reasonably be requested to carry out the terms, provisions and intent of this Agreement.

* 4.1. **Exclusivity.** Physician understands and agrees that during the term of this Agreement that he cannot and will not serve as Medical Director for any other trauma center or direct any other trauma center (American College of Surgeons requirement).

5.1. **Compensation.** Union shall pay Physician for Medical Director Services performed and documented under this Agreement at the rate of 1

per hour. This Agreement remains in force and effect (hereinafter "Medical Director Compensation") [The parties contemplate that Physician shall on an average perform 25 hours of service per month or up to 300 hours per contract year. The maximum hours of services performed pursuant to this Agreement shall not, absent written agreement, exceed 300 hours per contract year]. Physician shall be responsible for fully documenting the hours of work and services performed pursuant to this Agreement using the Documentation of Coverage for Union Hospital, Inc. form attached as **Exhibit A**. Such documentation shall describe the date of service, length of service and the service provided. Such documentation shall be submitted every two (2) weeks to Union. Physician shall not be eligible to receive any Medical Director Compensation if there is not written documentation submitted. Any documentation or claim for hourly payments submitted which is over two (2) weeks of time will be considered stale and not timely submitted and shall not be paid. Payment for documented hours of services, less applicable withholdings, shall be made through the Payroll Department with the next bi-weekly payment following the receipt of the documentation.

It is understood and agreed that all of Physician's services under this Agreement are administrative and that payment is hereinabove provided to be made from Union to Physician for Physician's administrative services as Medical Director.

6.1. **Facilities and Supplies.** Union will provide all physical facilities, including office and office help and supplies, both expendable and non-expendable, as determined reasonably necessary by Union for carrying out of Physician's duties as contemplated and described herein.

7.1. **Independent Contract.** It is expressly understood and agreed that the parties hereto shall at all times act as independent contractors with respect to each other and not as employees or agents of each other. Further, it is expressly understood and agreed by the parties that nothing contained in this Agreement shall be construed to create a joint venture, partnership, association or other affiliation or like relationship between the parties, it being specifically agreed that the relationship is and shall remain that of independent parties to a

contractual relationship as set forth in this Agreement. Further, Union shall have no influence or exercise any control over Physician's professional medical judgment involved or methods used in the rendering of any medical services. Physician shall be solely responsible for, and Union will not withhold or be responsible for (unless otherwise required to do so by any federal, state or local law or regulation), payment of taxes or withholdings on any compensation paid pursuant to this Agreement nor for any fringe benefits, professional liability insurance premiums, mileage, contribution to insurance and pension or other deferred compensation plans, including, but not limited to, worker's compensation, Social Security obligations, licensing fees, etc. No employee benefit plan or health care plan available to the employees of Union will be available to Physician.

8.1. **Insurance.** Throughout the term of this Agreement, Physician shall carry medical malpractice insurance in such amounts as to qualify as a "Provider" as defined under the Indiana Medical Malpractice Act (I.C. § 34-18-1-1 *et seq.*) as currently in force and effect or as subsequently amended, including carrying appropriate limits to qualify under such Act.. Union agrees to obtain, at its expense, and keep in full force and effect directors and officers liability coverage which would cover Physician for administrative services provided at the request of Union.

9.1. **Billing and Collection.**

9.1-1 **Union.** Union shall have the exclusive right to bill and collect for the technical component of all services rendered to the hospital pursuant to this Agreement. Union shall also have the exclusive right to bill and collect any "technical/facility component" of Level III Trauma Surgery Coverage.

9.1-2. **Physician.** Physician shall have the right to bill and collect and retain payments for any professional medical services provided by him. Physician will not receive any compensation or fees from Union for the performance of professional medical services.

10.1. **Termination.** In addition to the automatic termination provided for in Section 2.1 of this Agreement, this Agreement may be terminated in any of the following ways:

10.1-1. **Breach of Term.** If either party violates or breaches any material term or provision of this Agreement, the non-breaching party may terminate the Agreement if a breached material term or provision is not corrected by the breaching party within thirty (30) days after written notice thereof is given by the non-breaching party.

10.1-2. **Immediate For Cause Termination.** In addition, and not by way of limitation hereof, this Agreement may be immediately terminated at the discretion of and by Union for any one of the following reasons:

- (a) Revocation of license to practice, suspension, loss of federal and/or state narcotic numbers or licenses, or other major disciplinary action of any constituted authority against Physician.
- (b) Physician's professional misconduct.
- (c) The conviction of Physician of any crime punishable as a felony involving moral turpitude or immoral conduct.
- (d) The inability of Physician to render services to Union for a period of one hundred twenty (120) consecutive days due to Physician's illness or full and permanent physical and/or mental disability, unless the parties mutually

agree upon a substitute physician to serve during the pendency of such disability.

- (e) The death of Physician.
- (f) Commission of an act of fraud, or an act of dishonesty.
- (g) A violation of a federal or state law (e.g., violation of Medicare or Medicaid laws or rules, violation of Americans with Disabilities Act, Title VII violation, or acts constituting sexual harassment).

10.1-3. **For Cause Termination Following Notice and Opportunity to Cure.** In addition, and not by way of limitation hereof, this Agreement may also be terminated for cause if Physician, following notice, fails to cure within fifteen (15) days any of the following breaches or violations:

- (a) The use of alcohol, drug, or any controlled substance which materially impairs the ability of Physician to effectively perform Physician's duties and obligations under this Agreement; or
- (b) Jeopardizes or is detrimental to the health, safety or welfare of any patient, of a medical staff member, or employee of Union; or
- (c) Willfully disobeys or intentionally fails to carry out any reasonable rule or regulation of Union.
- (d) Commission of any misconduct which materially and adversely affects or is detrimental to the interest of Union, its patients, its medical staff or its employees.

10.1-4. **Mutual Agreement.** At any time by mutual written agreement of the parties.

10.1-5. **Termination Without Cause.** Either party shall have the right to terminate this Agreement with or without cause by giving the other party at least thirty (30) days prior written notice of that party's intention to terminate or end the Agreement.

11.1. **Compliance.** If this Agreement is determined to be a contract within the purview of Section 1861 (v)(1)(1) of the Federal Social Security Act (§952 of the Omnibus Reconciliation Act of 1980) and the regulations promulgated in implementation thereof of 42 CFR Part 420, Physician will make available to the Comptroller General of the United States, the Department of Health and Human Services and their duly authorized representatives, access to the books, documents and records of Physician, and such other information as may be required by the Comptroller General or Secretary of HHS to verify the nature and extent of the costs of the services provided by Physician. If Physician refuses to make the books, documents and records available for said inspection and if Union is denied reimbursement for said services as a result of Physician's refusal to make such records available, Physician shall indemnify Union for Union's loss or reduction in reimbursement. The obligation of parties to make records available shall extend for four (4) years after the furnishing of the latest services under this Agreement or any renewal thereof.

Physician shall at all times comply with and assist Union in complying with all applicable (i) laws, rules, regulations and policies of governmental authorities; (ii) standards and recommendations of Union's accrediting organization be that the Healthcare Facilities Accreditation Program (HFAP) or the Joint Commission; and (iii) policies, rules and regulations of Union Hospital, Inc. and Union's Medical and Dental Staff (if there are or would be conflicts between this Agreement and Union's personnel manual and/or policies this Agreement shall be deemed

to control); (iv) applicable Medicare, Medicaid, and Third-Party payors' rules, regulations and policies concerning treatment, reimbursement and billing procedures or practices; (v) policies and regulations of the State Department of Health; (vi) all applicable OSHA and IOSHA laws, rules and regulations, including provisions pertaining to bloodborne pathogens, (vii) Union's corporate compliance program; and (viii) the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act and the rules and regulations promulgated for such Act (HIPAA).

The parties agree that any products or services provided under this Agreement will comply in all material respects with all federal and state mandated regulations, rules or orders applicable to Union, including but not limited to regulations promulgated under Title II Subtitle F of the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (Public Law 104-191) – "HIPAA". Furthermore, the parties shall promptly amend this Agreement to conform with any new or revised legislation, rules and regulations to which the parties are subject now or in the future including, without limitation, the Standards for Privacy of Individually Identifiable Health Information or similar legislation (collectively, "Laws") in order to ensure that the parties are at all times in conformance with all Laws. If, within sixty (60) days of either party first providing notice to the other of the need to amend the Agreement to comply with Laws, the parties, acting in good faith, are (i) unable to mutually agree upon and make amendments or alterations to this Agreement to meet the requirements in question, or (ii) alternatively, the parties determine in good faith that amendments or alterations to the requirements are not feasible, then either party may terminate this Agreement upon fourteen (14) days prior written notice. The parties shall establish and maintain appropriate safeguards to prevent any improper use or disclosure of patients' protected health information.

12.1. **Entire Agreement.** This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relative to the provision of Medical Director Services.

13.1. **Amendments.** This Agreement may be amended only by an instrument in writing signed by both the parties hereto effective as of the date stipulated herein.

14.1. **Notices.** Notices or communications required or permitted to be given under this Agreement shall be given to the respective party by hand or by registered or certified mail (said notice being deemed given as of the date of receipt) and at the following addresses unless the party shall otherwise designate its address by notice.

15.1. **Medical Records.** All title to Union's records, charts, equipment, furnishings, and Union furnished supplies shall remain the sole property of Union. Physician shall be entitled, at his own expense, to secure copies of Union's records and charts.

16.1 **Confidentiality.** The parties hereto shall maintain the contents of this Agreement and any exhibits thereto, any other agreements executed pursuant to this Agreement and the negotiations leading thereto as confidential matters to be shared only by the parties, their Board of Directors, their attorneys, their accountants and those staff members and other agents whose knowledge is essential to the implementation of this Agreement or the management of the parties' business affairs. Any such person who is provided with such knowledge shall be instructed by the parties to keep such knowledge confidential and to take such steps as are necessary to insure confidentiality.

Any information and data relating to either party's business submitted to the other party pursuant to this Agreement shall be treated as confidential and shall not, unless otherwise required by law or the provisions of this Agreement, be disclosed to any third party without the other party's prior written consent. Further, the parties shall maintain all patient records and information confidential and shall not disclose that information to persons other than (a) members of Union's medical staff, (b) patients, parents, or guardians of patients as necessary for patient care, (c) state licensing boards, (d) Union's accrediting organization be that the Healthcare Facilities Accreditation Program (HFAP) or the Joint Commission, or (e) third party reimbursement agencies and professional organizations.

Physician further agrees that he shall not disclose information relating to Union's operations or patients to persons other than (a) members of Union's medical staff, (b) patients, parents, or guardians of patients as necessary for patient care, (c) state licensing boards, (d) Union's accrediting organization be that the Healthcare Facilities Accreditation Program (HFAP) or the Joint Commission, or (e) third party reimbursement agencies and professional organizations without written consent of Union or duly issued Court process or orders.

17.1. Miscellaneous.

17.1-1. Failure of any party to exercise a right or remedy under this Agreement shall not operate as a waiver of any such right or remedy upon subsequent occurrences.

17.1-2. The invalidity of any provision of this Agreement shall not affect the validity of the remaining provisions of this Agreement; and, if applicable, the Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid provision had been omitted.

17.1-3. This Agreement is considered personal between Union and Physician, and Physician will have no right to sell, assign, transfer or otherwise dispose of this Agreement or of any rights or duties hereunder.

17.1-4. There is no requirement or inducement created, nor does one exist, for Physician to refer patients to Union for services.

17.1-5. This Agreement shall be construed and enforced in accordance with the laws of the State of Indiana.

FIRST ADDENDUM TO MEDICAL DIRECTOR AGREEMENT

This First Addendum to Medical Director Agreement ("First Addendum") is entered into by and between **UNION HOSPITAL, INC.**, an Indiana nonprofit corporation ("Union") and **MARK O. LYNCH, M.D.** ("Physician").

WHEREAS, Union and Physician previously entered into a certain Medical Director Agreement which had a commencement date of June 1, 2015 ("Original Medical Director Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Original Medical Director Agreement contained a scrivener's error in terms of Union's Department to whom Physician was to submit his time documentation to and Union's Department who would make the payments.

NOW, THEREFORE, for good and lawful consideration, including the covenants and provisions set forth herein, Union and Physician agree to amend the Original Medical Director Agreement as follows:

Amendment One. By this First Addendum the parties jointly agree that as of the effective date of this First Addendum Section 5.1 of the Original Medical Director Agreement shall be **DELETED** and **REPLACED** and in its place the following new Section 5.1 inserted:

"5.1. **Compensation.** Union shall pay Physician for Medical Director Services performed and documented under this Agreement at the rate

that this

Agreement remains in force and effect (hereinafter "Medical Director Compensation") [The parties contemplate that Physician shall on an average perform 25 hours of service per month or up to 300 hours per contract year. The maximum hours of services performed pursuant to this Agreement shall not, absent written agreement, exceed 300 hours per contract year]. Physician shall be responsible for fully documenting the hours of work and services performed pursuant to this Agreement using the Documentation of Coverage for Union Hospital, Inc. form attached as Exhibit A. Such documentation shall describe the date of service, length of service and the service provided. Such documentation shall be submitted every two (2) weeks to Union. Physician shall not be eligible to receive any Medical Director Compensation if there is not written documentation submitted. Any documentation or claim for hourly payments submitted which is over two (2) weeks of time will be considered stale and not timely submitted and shall not be paid. Payment for documented hours of services shall be made through the Finance Department/Accounts Payable. (No withholdings shall be made by Union).

It is understood and agreed that all of Physician's services under this Agreement are administrative and that payment is hereinabove provided to be made from Union to Physician for Physician's administrative services as Medical Director."


This First Addendum shall be considered effective as of **June 1, 2015**.

POLICY:

The team is a multi-disciplinary panel of professionals assembled in an organized fashion to perform the tasks necessary to efficiently resuscitate seriously injured patients. This applies to all methods of arrival including, but not limited to ambulance, private vehicle, walk-in, police, or inter-facility transfer.

PURPOSE:

A team must be rapidly assembled to provide for the initial evaluation and resuscitation of trauma patients in an organized and efficient manner.

- To identify the criteria for Trauma Team Activation.
- To identify the Trauma Team Members
- To delineate the procedure for calling the Trauma Team Activation.

DEFINITIONS:

1. Trauma Team membership:

The Level 1 trauma alert team members are:

- Emergency physician
- General Surgeon- present within 30 minutes of patient arrival
- Three Emergency Department Licensed nursing staff
- Laboratory phlebotomist
- Respiratory Therapist
- Radiology Technologist
- CT Scan
- Patient Registration
- OR Front Desk is notified , they will notify anesthesia and open operating room is held open until cleared by surgeon
- Anesthesia

The Level 2 trauma alert team members are:

- Emergency physician
- Three Emergency Department Licensed nursing staff
- Laboratory phlebotomist
- Radiology-notification only
- CT Scan-notification only
- Patient Registration
- Trauma program manager

The individual roles of the team members are subject to change based on the needs of the patient and resources available during the resuscitation.

PROCEDURE:

- 1) Trauma Alert- The activation of a trauma alert will occur upon realization that any of the following conditions exist:
 - a) either upon arrival of the patient who meets trauma activation criteria
 - b) notification by EMS of Trauma Alert
 - c) identification of meeting the activation criteria at any time.
- 2) The unit secretary of the Emergency Department will be notified and activate the Trauma Team via Vocera broadcast to Trauma Group and via group page by the switchboard operator.
- 3) The level of alert, mechanism of injury, ETA, and assigned room will be included in the communication to the trauma team.
- 4) The ED will notify an ED physician of the trauma alert via in-department paging system.
- 5) If the trauma patient is greater than or equal to 20 weeks pregnant, the ED will notify the OB Hospitalist & Labor Room Triage of patient, upon physical exam of the patient in the ED the physician will determine need for consultation of neonatologist.
- 6) Upon arrival the patient will be evaluated by a physician for appropriate stabilization and management, specialty consult, and/or need for transfer identified or initiated.
- 7) Once the patient has been assessed, non-essential personnel will be dismissed by the ED physician or surgeon.
- 8) The physician will recognize trauma transfer criteria and call a Level 1 trauma center for consult on transfer providing the trauma center with the following information:
 - Trauma criteria

- Age of patient
- Vital Signs-Stable or Unstable
- Obvious Traumatic Injuries

- 9) Trauma patients being transferred to a Level 1 Trauma Center should be en-route within 2 hours after arrival when stabilized within the capabilities of Union Hospital, Inc.
- 10) Under & Over activation/triage will be monitored on a routine basis by the Trauma Program.
- 11) The tiered trauma alert will be evaluated through the Trauma Performance Improvement and Patient Safety Program.
- 12) In the event of a mass casualty event, the hospital disaster plan will be initiated.

2. Trauma Activation Criteria:

The graded two tier activation criteria are as follows: Leveling criteria are guidelines only. Leveling should be guided by the rationale for each level and by clinical judgment.
