B. Regulations

1. Lifeline Assistance is available to all residential customers who are currently participating in one of the following Federal Assistance Programs:
 - a) Medicaid
 - b) **Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)**
 - c) Supplemental Security Income (SSI) under Title XVI of the Social Security Act
 - d) Federal Public Housing Assistance or Section 8
 - e) Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP)
 - f) National School Lunch Program's Free Lunch Program
 - g) Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF)
2. To be eligible for Lifeline Assistance, the applicant's total household income must not exceed 135% of the federally established poverty levels set forth for the number of persons in the applicant's household.
3. The Access Line must be in the Lifeline recipient's name.
4. At no time shall a customer's Lifeline rate go below zero.
5. A Lifeline Service customer may not subscribe to any other type of residence Local Exchange Service at the same or other premises, e.g., a second access line.
6. Foreign Exchange and Vacation Service are not available on Lifeline.

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C. Obligations of the Company

1. Partial payments that are received from Lifeline customers will first be applied to local service charges and then to any outstanding toll charges.

B. Regulations

1. This credit is only available on the installation of a single residential access line at the principal residence of the eligible customer.
2. This credit will apply for a second or subsequent time only for a principal place of residence with an address different from the residence address at which Link-Up Assistance was provided previously.
3. An eligible low-income consumer may choose either or both the Service Connection Charges Credit and the Deferred Payment Schedule.
4. The applicant must not be a dependent for federal income tax purposes, unless he or she is 60 years of age or older. The Link Up America discount does not apply to applicants who are full-time students living in university or college controlled housing.

8. Link Up America applicants are not exempt from Telephone Company deposit requirements.
9. Service will not be established at discounted rates prior to receipt of certification. Service will be established at full service connection charges. If certification is received within 60 days of original application, credit will be applied to provide the Link Up America discount.
10. The Company reserves the right to periodically audit its records, working in conjunction with the appropriate state agencies, for the purpose of determining, continuing eligibility. Information obtained during such audit will be treated as confidential information to the extent required under State and Federal laws. The use or disclosure of information concerning enrollees will be limited to purposes directly connected with the administration of the Link Up plan.

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
