***RE: Richmond Power & Light Company's 30 Day Filing Pursuant to 170 IAC 1-6-1
et seq.***

Dear Ms. Howe:

In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-1, enclosed please find Richmond Power & Light Company's ("RP&L") proposed Appendix B, titled "Non-Recurring Charges." The revision contained in Appendix B positively impacts RP&L Customers. Under RP&L's current tariff, a normal disconnect charge is thirty dollars (\$30). Under the proposed revision, if the customer calls the customer service office and makes a credit card payment while the service person is at the residence for disconnect, RP&L will reduce the charge to fifteen dollars (\$15). That saves RP&L the time and labor of pulling the meter, and making a follow up trip to reconnect, and saves the customer fifteen dollars (\$15) and the interruption in services. If the service person makes a trip to a residence for reason of notice of disconnect, or cannot access the meter, the \$15 trip charge will apply.

The proposed revision to Appendix B is shown in the attached redlined tariff sheet and set forth below¹:

Trip Charge Labor	\$15.00 per trip
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¹ RP&L's Terms and Conditions also provide a utility may charge a reasonable trip charge when services are unable to be disconnected due to the inability to safely access the meter, or in an instance in which the utility makes a courtesy trip.

The Indiana Administrative Code allows for changes of the type reflected in the attached Appendix B to be made to a utility's tariff via a 30 day filing. Specifically, 170 IAC 1-6-3(4) allows for 30 day filings for "Nonrecurring charges." 170 IAC 1-6-2 (11) defines a "Nonrecurring charge" to mean "a charge to a utility customer for costs incurred by the utility outside the context of month-to-month service (...)."

The charge that RP&L is intending to initiate would be a nonrecurring charge, as it would be outside the context of month-to-month service. Thus, this filing is an allowable request under 170 IAC 1-6-4.

Further, this filing does not require confidential treatment nor does it seek any other relief identified in 170 IAC 1-6-4, and therefore it is not prohibited under the Commission's Rule. In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-5(2), contact information for the utility regarding this filing is:

In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-5(3), the proposed revised Appendix B is attached. There are no work papers necessary to support this filing as required in 170 IAC 1-6-5(4), as there is not a proposed rate increase, but merely an alternative charge to a disconnect fee.

In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-5(5), I have verified this letter as to these representations in compliance with 170 IAC 1-6-5(5). A copy of this filing is being provided via electronic mail to the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor ("OUCC"). Furthermore, RP&L via legal counsel and staff has discussed this filing with the OUCC, and prior to RP&L's filing the OUCC stated that it did not have a concern with this matter proceeding as a 30 day filing.

In accordance with 170 IAC 1-6-6, RP&L provided notice to its customers on March 3rd, 2015. A copy of the notice that was published is attached hereto. A copy of the proof of publication will be provided upon its receipt. RP&L has posted notice of this change in its local customer service office at 44 South 8th St., Richmond, Indiana, and has placed the notice on its website under pending tariffs (see <http://www.rp-l.com/services>).

Legal Notice of 30 Day Filing

On or about March 3rd, 2015, Richmond Power & Light Company (“RP&L”) will submit a revised tariff to the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (“Commission”) for approval under its 30-Day Filing procedures, 170 IAC 1-6-1, *et seq.* Under RP&L’s current tariff, a normal disconnect charge is thirty dollars (\$30). However, under the proposed revision, if the customer calls the customer service office and makes a credit card payment while the service person is at the residence for disconnect, RP&L will reduce the charge to fifteen dollars (\$15). If the service person makes a trip to a residence for reason of notice of disconnect, or cannot access the meter, the \$15 trip charge will apply. 


