On May 23, 2001, the Federal Communications Commission issued an Order¹ (“the FCC’s RTF Order”) assigning to state commissions the responsibility of certifying whether rural carriers are using federal high-cost support in a manner consistent with the requirements of Section 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996. Pursuant to Section 254(e), carriers must use universal service support “only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended.” The FCC’s RTF Order provided that state certifications should be submitted by October 1 each year for payments to be made during the following calendar year. If a rural carrier is not certified by its state commission, it will not receive federal high-cost support.

In order to carry out the FCC’s directive, this Commission issued a consolidated order in this Cause and Cause No. 40785 prescribing forms to be filled out and procedures to be followed by those rural carriers seeking certification. Upon reviewing the applications submitted by rural carriers seeking certification, the Commission has since issued orders annually in this Cause certifying the eligibility of Indiana rural carriers to receive federal high-cost support. Since then, the Commission’s certification responsibility was codified “concerning universal service and access to telecommunications service and equipment, including the designation of eligible telecommunications carriers under 47 U.S.C. 214.” I.C. 8-1-2.6-13(d)(5).

The FCC requires that carriers maintain detailed records. Specifically, recipients of high-cost support must “retain all records that they may require to demonstrate to auditors that the support they received was consistent with the Act and the Commission’s rules[.]” *In the Matter of Comprehensive Review of the Universal Service Fund Management, Administration, and Oversight*, 22 F.C.C.R. 16372 at ¶ 24 (adopted Aug. 22, 2007, rel. Aug. 29, 2007.) The documents include, “without limitation”, data supporting the calculation of line counts; customer records; fixed asset accounting documents; invoices and contracts for the purchase and maintenance of equipment or its upgrading; ledgers; and any other relevant documentation pertaining to the use of universal service funds. *Id.* In our Order in this Cause issued on

September 19, 2007, we advised carriers that such documentation must be maintained, consistent with FCC mandates, and that the Commission may request such documentation in the future to assure that carriers' costs are compliant and that carriers are eligible for certification.

Upon reviewing the completed applications, the Commission now finds that the applications that have been submitted by the applicants listed in Attachment A demonstrate the requisite compliance with the requirements of Section 254(e) of the Telecommunications Act of 1996, as interpreted by the FCC's RTF Order and this Commission's August 22, 2001 Order. More specifically, based on the completed applications, we find that all entities listed in Attachment A to this Order will be using federal high-cost support only for the provision, maintenance, and upgrading of facilities and services for which the support is intended, consistent with Section 254 (e) of the Communications Act.

In accordance with the FCC's RTF Order, we direct the Commission's Secretary to inform the Universal Services Administrative Company ("USAC") and the FCC that this Commission has certified that the carriers identified in Attachment A to this Order have met the requirements of Section 254(e) and the FCC's RTF Order.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE INDIANA UTILITY REGULATORY COMMISSION that:

1. The Indiana carriers identified in Attachment A to this Order shall be, and hereby are, certified by this Commission as having satisfied the requirements of Section 254(e) and the FCC's RTF Order.
2. The Commission's Secretary shall inform the FCC and USAC by October 1, 2010 that the aforementioned Indiana carriers have been so certified.
3. The Commission's Secretary shall forward a copy of this Order to all carriers identified in Attachment A.
4. This Order shall be effective on and after the date of its approval.
