PREHEARING CONFERENCE ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

On July 30, 2014, the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (“Commission”) commenced this investigation into the compliance of Snow & Ogden Gas Company, Inc. (“Snow & Ogden”) with pipeline safety standards and requirements.

Pursuant to notice and as provided for in 170 IAC 1-1.1-15, a Prehearing Conference in this Cause was held at 10:30 a.m. on August 13, 2014 in Room 224 of the PNC Center, 101 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. Proofs of publication of the notice of the Prehearing Conference have been incorporated into the record and placed in the official files of the Commission. Counsel for the Commission’s Pipeline Safety Division (“Division”) and Counsel for the Indiana Office of Utility Consumer Counselor (“OUCC”) appeared and participated at the Prehearing Conference. Joe Ramsey of Snow & Ogden appeared without counsel. No members of the general public appeared.

Prior to the opening of the record and with the consent of all parties in attendance, an informal discussion was held regarding procedural and scheduling matters in this Cause. The Division and the OUCC also requested a field hearing be established for the purpose of soliciting input from the public concerning alternative service options should the Commission determine Snow & Ogden is not in compliance. Because the purpose of this investigation is to receive information to enable the Commission to determine whether Snow & Ogden is in compliance, we believe the Division’s and OUCC’s request is premature. Although we decline to set a formal field hearing, this does not limit either the Division or the OUCC from contacting and meeting with Snow & Ogden’s customers.

Based upon the agreement of the parties, the Commission now enters the following Findings and Order which shall become a part of the record in this proceeding:

1. **Division’s Prefiling Date.** The Division shall prefile with the Commission its prepared testimony and exhibits constituting its case-in-chief on or before September 2, 2014. Copies of same shall be served upon all parties of record.

2. **Appearance of Counsel for Snow & Ogden.** Snow & Ogden shall seek and retain legal counsel to represent its interests in this proceeding. Counsel shall file an appearance in this Cause on or before September 2, 2014.

3. **Snow & Ogden's Prefiling Date.** Snow & Ogden shall prefile with the Commission its prepared testimony and exhibits constituting its case-in-chief on or before October 2, 2014. Copies of same shall be served upon all parties of record.

4. **OUCC's and Intervenors' Prefiling Date.** The OUCC and all Intervenors shall prefile with the Commission the prepared testimony and exhibits constituting their respective cases-in-chief on or before November 3, 2014. Copies of same shall be served upon all parties of record.

5. **Division's Rebuttal Prefiling Date.** The Division shall prefile with the Commission its prepared rebuttal testimony on or before November 13, 2014. Copies of same shall be served upon all parties of record.

6. **Cross-Reply Prefiling Date.** The parties shall prefile any cross-reply responding to another party's case-in-chief on or before November 13, 2014. Copies of same shall be served upon all parties of record.

7. **Evidentiary Hearing.** An evidentiary hearing is scheduled to commence at 9:30 a.m. on December 4, 2014 in Room 224 of the PNC Center, 101 West Washington Street, Indianapolis, Indiana. At such time, the direct and rebuttal evidence of the respective parties should be presented and their respective witnesses examined. If the parties reach settlement, the agreement and supporting testimony and exhibits shall be submitted to the Commission five (5) business days prior to the Evidentiary Hearing.

8. **Sworn Testimony.** Any witness testimony to be offered into the record of this proceeding shall be made under oath or affirmation. In accordance with 170 IAC 1-1.1-18(h), if the prefiled testimony of a witness is to be offered into evidence at the Evidentiary Hearing, and the witness sponsoring the prefiled testimony is not required to, and does not, attend the Evidentiary Hearing, the prefiled testimony shall be accompanied by the witness's sworn affidavit or written verification at the time the evidence is offered into the record.

9. **Discovery.** Discovery is available for all parties and shall be conducted on an informal basis. Any response or objection to a discovery request shall be made within (10) calendar days of the receipt of such request.

10. **Prefiling of Workpapers.** When prefiling technical evidence with the Commission, each party shall file copies of the work papers used to produce that evidence within two (2) business days after the prefiling of the technical evidence. Copies of same shall also be provided to any other party requesting such in writing. When submitting workpapers to the Commission, two (2) copies of each document shall be filed with the Secretary of the Commission.

11. Number of Copies/Corrections. With the exception of work papers, the parties shall file with the Commission an original and five (5) copies of all prefiled testimony and exhibits. Any corrections to prefiled testimony shall be made in writing as soon as possible after discovery of the need to make such corrections. Although the Commission's rules require that original copies be one-sided, it is the Commission's preference that duplicate copies use both sides of the paper.

Parties may also elect to file documents with the Commission using the Commission's Electronic Filing System in lieu of filing paper documents. Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Electronic Filing System, documents filed electronically are deemed filed the date they are submitted, subject to verification and acceptance by the Commission, and will receive an electronic file stamp. For filings greater than thirty (30) pages in length, a party shall file with the Commission an original and one (1) paper copy within two (2) business days of the electronic filing. When supplying such copies, the party must provide a copy of the email reflecting the electronic filing was accepted by the Commission.

12. Objections to Prefiled Testimony and Exhibits. Any objections to the admissibility of prefiled testimony or exhibits shall be filed with the Commission and served on all parties of record no less than two (2) business days prior to the date scheduled for commencement of the hearing at which the testimony or exhibit will be offered into the record.

13. Intervenors. Any party permitted to become an Intervenor in this Cause shall be bound by the record as it stands at the time its Petition to Intervene is granted, pursuant to 170 IAC 1-1.1-11.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED BY THE INDIANA UTILITY REGULATORY COMMISSION that:

1. The determinations of the Prehearing Conference set forth in this Order are made a part of the record in this Cause and shall be binding on all present and future parties of record during the proceedings of this Cause.

2. This Order shall be effective on and after the date of its approval.
