INDIANA UTILITY REGULATORY COMMISSION
ATTORNEY/ADMINISTRATIVE LAW JUDGE

The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC or Commission) is seeking to fill an attorney position in its Office of General Counsel. The person filling this position will provide legal advice and expertise to the Commission in a number of areas including: utility compliance with existing laws and regulations, matters of public policy, and acceptable standards of operation. Obligations under this position also include acting as an Administrative Law Judge in proceedings before the Commission.

The IURC is a fact-finding body that hears evidence in cases filed before it and makes decisions based on the evidence presented in those cases. An advocate of neither the public nor the utilities, the IURC is required by state statute to make decisions that balance the interests of all parties to ensure the utilities provide adequate and reliable service at reasonable prices. The mission of the IURC is to ensure that utilities and others use adequate planning and resources in order to provide safe, adequate, and reliable utility service at a reasonable cost. Primary responsibilities will include but are not limited to:

- Serving as an advisor to the Commission regarding legal issues and issues of public policy
- Conducting legal research on issues faced by the Commission
- Undertaking administrative rulemakings on behalf of the Commission
- Presiding over and coordinating all aspects of Administrative Hearings
- Ruling on motions, objections, and other issues that arise in Commission proceedings.
- Working collaboratively with other assigned staff to draft recommended Orders for Commission review

Education and Experience

- A Juris Doctorate degree and admission, in good standing, to the Indiana Bar are required.
- Minimum of 2 years work experience as a practicing attorney required
- Limited litigation experience is required.
- Candidates should have knowledge of utility law or a related field, administrative law, statutory interpretation, Indiana Rules of Trial Procedure, and Indiana Rules of Evidence.
- Knowledge of utility and regulatory practices and procedures is desired but not required.
- Applicants must demonstrate superior capabilities to communicate orally and in writing.
- Excellent organizational skills are required in order to balance the demands of a sizable caseload and other assignments.
- Applicants must be able to work productively with limited supervision and in a collaborative setting.
- Applicants must be able to analyze technical information found in staff reports, filings, testimony, data, exhibits and tariffs in order to understand and identify issues, make accurate rulings, and communicate a complete legal analysis.
