Currently, Susan serves as an attorney/advisor in the General Counsel's Office of the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC). In this capacity, Susan advises the FERC on complex issues associated with energy wholesale markets.

Prior to joining FERC, Susan served as General Counsel to the Maryland Public Service Commission (PSC) from 1999 to 2007. Susan began her tenure with the PSC in 1987 as a Special Assistant to Commissioner Linda Thomas. In 1989, Susan was promoted to Assistant General Counsel in the PSC's Office of General Counsel.

While in the Office of General Counsel, Susan represented the Commission in State and Federal Court, before the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission, and before the Federal Communications Commission. Susan served as a member of the Governor's Advisory Board for Telecommunications Relay and as a member of the Staff Committee of the Federal-State Joint Board on Universal Service. Finally, Susan represented the PSC before the Maryland General Assembly.

Prior to joining the PSC, Susan was a Committee Assistant and Legislative Drafter for the Maryland General Assembly, as well as a counsel to the Economic Matters Committee.

Susan is a graduate of the University of Maryland Law School. Susan was a Notes and Comments Editor with the Maryland Law Review and published three articles. She received her Bachelor of Arts Degree in Political Science from the University of Maryland in Baltimore County.
