If more is required or if explanations for our recommended changes would be beneficial, please advise.

I would like to add two sentences both on Page 6 of 8. Under section IC 8-1-37-13. Sec 13. (b) there are currently numbers (1), (2), (3), and (4). Please add (5) Electricity generated for and sold to a customer for regenerating a clean energy resource.

The next section on the same page is IC 8-1-37-13. Sec. 13 (c) there are currently numbers (1) and (2). Please add (3) Or, generating for, purchasing from or selling electricity to a customer for the purpose of recycling, resmelting or recharging the exhausted feedstock of any clean energy resource as defined in IC 8-1-37-4 Sec. 4 (a).

Kurt,

Thank you for your interest and participation in the IURC rulemaking to establish the Indiana Voluntary Clean Energy Portfolio Standard program.

Just to clarify – the statute authorizing the rulemaking is Ind. Code 8-1-37. While the rule will contain some of the same language as the statute, the rule will be an entirely new and separate document from the statute and will not be amending the language of the statute.

With that clarification in mind, as I understand your recommendations below, you are recommending that, in determining whether to grant an incentive and how much of an incentive should be granted pursuant to IC 8-1-37-13(b), one of the considerations or factors should be whether the electricity was generated for and sold to a customer for regenerating a clean energy resource. You are also recommending that cost recovery via a periodic rate adjustment mechanism, pursuant to IC 8-1-37-13(c), be allowed for generating for, purchasing from or selling electricity to a customer for the purpose of recycling, resmelting or recharging the exhausted feedstock of any clean energy resource as defined in IC 8-1-37-4(a). Please confirm that my understanding is correct.

One question – would you also be recommending that “generation of electricity for the purpose of recycling, resmelting or recharging the exhausted feedstock of any clean energy resource as defined in IC 8-1-37-4(a)” be included in the definition of a clean energy resource under the IURC’s authority to add clean energy resources under IC 8-1-37-4(a)(15)?
