

## Kenneth Rose Brief Bio

Kenneth Rose is an independent consultant, a Senior Fellow with the Institute of Public Utilities at Michigan State University, and a Lecturer with the John Glenn School of Public Affairs at Ohio State University. Dr. Rose is a nationally recognized expert with more than twenty-eight years of research experience on the structure, economics, and regulation of the U.S. electric supply industry. He has written or contributed to many reports, papers, articles, and books and has testified or presented at many legislative and public utility commission hearings, proceedings, conferences, and workshops.

Dr. Rose's areas of expertise include electricity wholesale and retail markets, market power and market monitoring, and environmental regulation and impact associated with electricity production. Other research topics include competitive bidding for power supply, regulatory treatment of utility costs, and Clean Air Act implementation. Dr. Rose was a Senior Institute Economist at The National Regulatory Research Institute at Ohio State University (OSU) from 1989 to 2002 and a lecturer for the School of Public Policy and Management at OSU. He worked on energy related issues at Argonne National Laboratory from 1984 to 1989.

Dr. Rose received his B.S. (1981), M.A. (1983), and Ph.D. (1988) in Economics from the University of Illinois at Chicago.
