**INDIANA UTILITY REGULATORY COMMISSION**  
**UTILITY ANALYST – Natural Gas Division**

**The Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission (IURC) is seeking a Utility Analyst** to provide technical advice and expertise in a number of areas including utility compliance with existing laws and regulations, matters of public policy, and acceptable standards of operation. This position works as a professional analyst for the Natural Gas Division and the Agency. Duties are performed with moderate supervision and require self-drive, organization and initiative. This position reports directly to the Division Director.

The IURC's mission is to assure that utilities and others use adequate planning and resources for the provision of safe and reliable utility services at reasonable cost. For more information about the IURC visit the website at [www.in.gov/iurc/](http://www.in.gov/iurc/).

Primary responsibilities will include but are not limited to:

- Serves as a technical advisor, as assigned, to Commissioners and Administrative Law Judges during the evaluation of rate cases and other utility-related matters. This may include cases and rulemakings required by Federal Commissions and/or Indiana statutes
- Monitors utility compliance with Federal and Indiana statutes, administrative codes and Commission orders
- Analysis of evidence from various parties regarding financial matters, rate designs, tariff rates and charges of utilities; the promotion of improved energy efficiency, planning, procurement; and the costs, risks and benefits of alternative regulatory approaches
- Reading and reviewing all relevant utility applications, petitions, testimony, schedules and exhibits
- Gathering information through data requests, and by attending relevant case hearings and staff meetings
- Applying basic accounting, economic, financial, statistical, and engineering theory to the issues
- Performing topical independent research to enhance broad knowledge of technical issues and public policy implications
- Ability to manage detail and analyze long-term effects and to transition between the two perspectives
- Preparing written reports for internal review
- Responding to inquiries through the Commission Public Information Office from the public, state agencies and utility representatives
- Assisting the legal staff in addressing regulatory issues
- Representing the IURC in industry meetings and investigations
- Preparing testimony and testifying at Commission hearings as necessary
- Working with multi-disciplinary teams that may include attorneys, economists, accountants, engineers and other specialists
- Attends training as required
- Serves as a team leader, as assigned, on routine cases or other agency-related matters

**Qualifications**

- Minimum of a Bachelor's degree in a relevant field of study
- Two (2) years experience in a professional business setting, or an advanced degree may substitute for professional work experience
- Organization, accuracy, theoretical consistency and clarity are required for all written documents and oral discussions
- Ability to analyze filings, testimony, data, exhibits and tariffs in order to understand and identify issues and to communicate results orally and in writing to appropriate parties
- Ability to make objective and well reasoned recommendations both verbally and in writing
- Ability to work independently and in teams in a timely and well organized manner
- Extensive computer skills in Microsoft Office
