The following Final Article "A" and Preliminary Article "A" are submitted to each of you to acquaint you with the tariffs eligible for action or acceptance on or after May 7, 2008.

"A" Final

The following miscellaneous item(s) will be eligible for final consideration at the next Commission Conference and based upon review by staff members of the Commission, I recommend approval.

1. Indiana Bell Telephone Company, Inc. d/b/a AT&T Indiana

The Company proposes to modify service boundaries between the Cedar Lake and Lowell exchanges, both of which are served by AT&T Indiana. This change is proposed to facilitate common exchange service to new residential sub-division.

Customer Notification

Customer notification is not required. Boundary change will not affect any foreign exchange or existing facilities or services.

Project Details

The area involved is located in R9W and T33N, section 4. Detailed schematics of the boundary area change is attached.

The existing southern Wire Center Boundary between the Cedar Lake and Lowell exchanges currently follows the Hanover Township and West Creek Township boundaries. The township line is 1,200 feet north of 151st Street.

The proposed change drops the wire center boundary line from the existing township line at the centerline of Parrish Avenue, south to the intersection of 151st Street and Parrish Avenue. The new line will follow the centerline of 151st Street, west to the N.Y.C.R.R. tracks. The new line will then proceed north along the railroad tracks to existing Wire Center Boundary.

AT&T Indiana Supporting Documentation

On March 19, 2008, AT&T Indiana attached a copy of the exchange area map for Cedar Lake, Fourth Revision, dated June 27, 1996. The original Cedar Lake map was filed with the Commission on August 13, 1959. The Cedar Lake exchange service area lies within Lake County.

AT&T Indiana also attached a copy of the exchange area map for Lowell, Second Revision, dated July 1, 1976. The original Lowell map was filed with the Commission on September 8, 1953. The Lowell exchange service area lies within Lake County.


In its March 19 filing, AT&T Indiana enclosed Certificates of Territorial Authority for the Cedar Lake Exchange, Fourth Revision (June 27, 1996) and for the Lowell Exchange, Second Revision (July 1, 1976), which are being surrendered for the issuance of proposed revised certificates: Cedar Lake-Fifth Revision and Lowell-Third Revision.

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- The *tariff sheet* to be superseded for the proposed *Cedar Lake* boundary change Indiana is Indiana Bell Tel. Co., Inc., IURC No. 20, Part 4, Section 6, Original Sheet No. 1 (“Cedar Lake”), Fourth Revision. The replacement sheet will be considered the Fifth Revision for this tariff sheet.
- The *Lowell boundary map* to be superseded is entitled Indiana Bell Telephone Company, Incorporated. Exchange Area Map (“Lowell”). Second Revision (Effective July 1, 1976). The replacement map will be considered the Third Revision. The Lowell boundary map is a stand-alone document; it is not included in the IURC No. 20 Tariff.

"A" Preliminary

The following new miscellaneous item has been reviewed by staff members of the Commission and we recommend accepting it for filing.

1. Southern Indiana Gas and Electric Company (Electric)


The utility requests Commission approval to:

- 1) Revise the Capacity Credit definition in Rider IC - Interruptible Contract Rider from "Unadjusted Capacity Payment to a Qualifying Facility" to "Capacity Payment to a Qualifying Facility".
- 2) Revise the Interrupted Capacity Credit definition in Rider IO - Interruptible Option Rider from "Unadjusted Capacity Payment to a Qualifying Facility" to "Capacity Payment to a Qualifying Facility".

The intent of these Riders is to provide credits to customers based on a percentage of the capacity payment applicable to qualifying facilities. This change in language makes the tariff language clearer, but does not have any effect on the calculated capacity credits, which have always been adjusted by a percentage of the capacity payment to a qualifying facility.
